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A BILL FOR AN ACT ANTITLED:

ACT PROVIDING FOR THE

ISSUANCE OF NONRESIDENT BIG GAME COMBINATION AND NONRESIDENT

DEER COMBINATION LICENSES ON A PERCENTAGE BASIS THAT MATCHES

THE PERCENTAGE OF APPLICATIONS FOR GUIDED AND UNGUIDED HUNTS

RATHER THAN ON A RESERVE SYSTEM; REVISING THE METHOD OF SALE

OF CLASS B-10 AND CLASS B-11 LICENSES: AMENDING SECTIONS

87-2-505, 87-2-510, AND 87-2-511, MCA: AND PROVIDING A

DELAYED EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 87-2-505, MCA, is amended to read:

*87-2-505. (Temporary) Class B-10--nonresident big game combination license. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a person who is not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment of the fee of \$462-beginning-March-17 1992,-and-9475-beginning-March-1,-1994,-or-upon--payment--of the--fee-of-\$472-beginning-March-1;-1992;-and \$485 beginning March-17-19947-if-the-license-is-one-of-the--57600--licenses reserved -- pursuant -- to -- 87-2-511 -- for -- applicants - indicating their-intent-to-use-the-services-of-a-licensed-outfitter and

subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to purchase a B-10 nonresident big game combination license which-shall-entitle that entitles the holder to all the privileges of Class B, Class B-1, and Class B-7 and an elk tag. This license includes the nonresident conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202. Not more than 17,000 Class B-10 licenses may be sold in any one license year. (Terminates March 1, 1996--sec. 3, Ch.

87-2-505. (Effective March 19961 Class B-10--nonresident big game combination license. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a person who is not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment of the fee of \$398--or--upon--payment-of-the-fee-of \$408 if-the-license-is one-of-the-57600-licenses-reserved-pursuant-to-07-2-511--for applicants--indicating-their-intent-to-use-the-services-of-a licensed-outfitter and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to purchase a B-10 nonresident big game combination license which-shall-entitle that entitles the holder to all the privileges of Class B, Class B-1, and Class B-7 licenses, and an elk tag. This license includes

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the nonresident conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202. Not more than 17,000 Class B-10 licenses may be sold in any one license year."

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Section 2. Section 87-2-510, MCA, is amended to read:

*87-2-510. (Temporary) Class B-11--nonresident deer combination license. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a person who is not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment of a fee of \$238-beginning-March-1--1992and-\$245-beginning-March-17-19947-or-upon-payment-of-the-fee of-\$248-beginning-March-17-19927-and \$250 beginning-March-17 19947-if-the-license-is-one-of-the-47000--reserved--pursuant to-87-2-511-for-applicants-indicating-their-intent-either-to use--the--services-of-a-licensed-outfitter-or-to-hunt-with-a resident-sponsor-on-land-owned-by-that-sponsor and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the fish and game office. Helena, Montana, to purchase a Class B-11 nonresident deer combination license that entitles the holder to all the privileges of the Class B, Class B-1, and Class B-7 licenses. This license includes the nonresident wildlife conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202.

(2) Six thousand Class B-11 licenses are authorized for 24 25 sale each license year.

1 87-2-510. (Effective March 1. 1994) Class B-11--nonresident deer combination license. (1) Except as 3 otherwise provided in this chapter, a person who is not a 4 resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years 5 of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment of a fee of \$220-or-upon-payment-of-the-fee-of \$225 if--the--license--is 8 one---of---the--4,000--reserved--pursuant--to--07-2-511--for 9 applicants--indicating--their--intent--either--to--use---the 10 services--of-a-licensed-outfitter-or-to-hunt-with-a-resident 11 sponsor-on-land-owned-by-that-sponsor and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, 12 13 apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to 14 purchase a Class B-11 nonresident deer combination license 15 that entitles the holder to all the privileges of the Class B, Class B-1, and Class B-7 licenses. 21 Section 3. Section 87-2-511, MCA, is amended to read:

22 *87-2-511. Sale of Class B-10 and Class B-11 licenses.

23 (1) The department shall offer the Class B-10 and Class B-11

24 licenses for sale on March January 15, with--5,600--of--the

25 authorized-Class-B-10-licenses-and-2,000-Class-B-11-licenses

reserved allocated as provided in subsection (3) for applicants-indicating-their-intent-to-use-the-services-of--a licensed--outfitter;--and-2;000-of-the-authorized-Class-B-ll licenses-reserved-for-applicants-indicating-their-intent--to hunt--with-a-resident-sponsor-on-land-owned-by-that-sponsor; as-provided-in-subsections-(2)-and-(3).

- (2) Each application for a reserved license under subsection (1) must contain a written affirmation that whether or not the applicant intends to hunt with a licensed outfitter or—a-resident—sponsor and, when applicable, must indicate the name of the licensed outfitter or—resident sponsor with whom the applicant intends to hunt. In addition, the application must be accompanied by a certificate that is signed by a licensed outfitter or resident—sponsor and which that affirms that the outfitter or—resident will:
- 17 (a) direct the applicant's hunting and advise the 18 applicant of game and trespass laws of the state;
 - (b) submit to the department, in a manner prescribed by the department, complete records of who hunted with him the outfitter, where they hunted, and what game was taken; and
 - (c) accept no monetary consideration for enabling the nonresident applicant to obtain a license or for providing any services or assistance to the nonresident applicant, except as provided in this title.

- (3) The-certificate-signed-by-the-resident-sponsor pursuant-to-subsection-(2)-must-also-affirm-that-the-sponsor is-a-landowner-and-that-the-applicant-under-the-certificate will-hunt-only-on-land-owned-by-the-sponsor. Applications for a Class B-10 or Class B-11 license that indicate that the applicant intends to conduct a guided or an unguided hunt must be drawn on a percentage basis that matches the respective percentage of applications for guided or unguided hunts in each license category.
- (4) The department shall make the reserved Class B-10 and Class B-11 licenses that remain unsold on April 15 available to nonresident applicants without-restriction-as to-hunting-with-a-licensed-outfitter-or-resident-sponsor by drawing on April 15 on a first-come basis from applications received by mail.

STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0167, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act providing for the issuance of nonresident big game combination and nonresident deer combination licenses on a percentage basis that matches the percentage of applications for guided and unguided hunts rather than a reserve system; revising the method of sale of class B-10 and class B-11 licenses; and providing an delayed effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There will be at least 17,000 applications for the non-resident big game combination licenses and at least 6,000 applications for the non-resident deer combination licenses.
- 2. The wildlife habitat program (Section 87-1-242, MCA) remains in place.
- 3. Affirmations for non-guided hunts will be part of the license application forms and affirmations for guided hunts will separate forms.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Expenditures: No change anticipated.

Revenues:

Under current law outfitter and landowner sponsored licenses cost \$10.00 more for the big game combo and \$5.00 more for the deer combo. Under the proposed law, all licenses would be sold for the higher price.
