(2) The majority and minority leaders of each house
shall each designate a committee member from an existing
public service commission district. There may be no more
than one committee member from each existing public service
commission district. Within 20 days after their designation,



1 the committee members shall select a presiding officer of 2 the committee from the remaining public service commission 3 district not represented on the committee. If the members 4 fail to select the presiding officer within the time 5 prescribed, a majority of the supreme court shall select the 6 presiding officer.

7 (3) The committee shall use the following criteria in8 preparing the plan:

9 (a) The population of each district must be as nearly10 equal in population as is practicable.

11 (b) The relative population deviation from the ideal 12 population for an individual district may not exceed plus or 13 minus 5%.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0186, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act creating a committee to reapportion the Public Service Commission districts; providing for the reapportionment of Public Service Commission districts; providing that a reapportionment plan for Public Service Commission districts be presented to the next (1995) Legislature.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Public Service Commission (PSC) Redistricting Commission is composed of five members.
- 2. The PSC Redistricting Commission will hold 10 meetings. The 10 meetings will include at least five hearings, at least one hearing in each district, throughout the state to accept testimony on proposed PSC districts.
- 3. Current Legislative Council staff will do advance work in creating newly apportioned PSC districts, including traveling to the areas affected by the proposed district boundaries. Legislative Council staff will also accompany the Redistricting Commission members at all public hearings.
- 4. The cost of operating the Redistricting Commission, including conducting the public hearings, salary, per diem, and travel for the commission members, will be about \$18,361.
- 5. The cost of Legislative Council staff travel and per diem will be about \$3,500.
- 6. The costs incurred by the Redistricting Commission will be biennial.
- 7. The Legislative Council has not requested funding for the Redistricting Commission.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

PSC districts will be apportioned based on population data from the decennial census and will more accurately allow representation on the PSC on a "one person, one vote" basis. There is no discernable long-term financial effect of this legislation.

TECHNICAL NOTES:

- 1. There is no indication that newly drawn PSC districts must be compact or contiguous. If the districts are to be compact or contiguous, the Redistricting Commission should be so instructed.
- 2. The PSC Redistricting Commission should be given a specific date or legislative day by which the redistricting plan must be submitted to the Legislature.
