1 9 WHEREAS many qualified persons are reluctant to become 10 typedia safety instructors because of a perception of ///loon 11 potential exposure to liability for the conduct, acts, or 12 omissions of students: and 13 WHEREAS, providing an exemption from liability will 14 encourage more persons to undertake the teaching of firearm 15 safety, thereby improving the quality and availability of 16 firearm safety instruction in Montana.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Immunity of firearm safety instructor. (1) A firearm safety instructor is not liable for the conduct, acts, or omissions of students who are taught according to reasonable and contemporary standards.

- (2) As used in this section, "reasonable and contemporary standards" includes:
 - (a) a minimum of 5 hours of classroom instruction time;

- (b) a minimum of 1 hour of live-fire shooting practice at a suitable shooting location; and
- (c) instruction concerning the mechanics of firearm operation, safe firearm handling, and home firearm safety; responsibilities of firearm owners; and allowable uses of lethal force.
- (3) To qualify for immunity, a firearm safety instructor shall maintain sufficient records to demonstrate that particular students have been taught according to reasonable and contemporary standards.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.

[Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 27, chapter 1, part 7, and the provisions of Title 27, chapter 1, part 7, apply to [section 1].
