BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 23-5-310, MCA, is amended to read:

13 runs. (1) A senior citizen center is exempt from 23-5-306,
14 23-5-308, and 23-5-309 if the center:

15 (1)(a) limits participation in live card games to its
16 members and members' guests;

(2)(b) limits live card game activities to its main
premises or place of operation; and

(3)(c) does not operate live card games in a predominantly commercial manner.

(2) (a) Poker runs are authorized gambling. The only poker games that may be played in a poker run are those card games that are authorized under 23-5-311 and by department rule.

(b) "Poker run" means a live poker card game in which

each participant pays a valuable consideration to travel to designated locations and obtain a playing card at each location. Each participant accumulates the cards to make a poker hand, after which the participants' hands are compared 5 and the participant with the best hand, as described in the rules of the person or entity holding the poker run, is the winner. The rules may provide for more than one winner of ranked hands, with each winner receiving a prize, but a prize may not exceed \$300 in value. Except as provided in 10 subsection (2)(c), all consideration paid to participate 11 must be expended on the prize or prizes. 12 (c) An organization granted an exemption under 26 13  $0.8.C._{501}(c)(3), (c)(4), (c)(8), or (c)(19) is exempt from$ 14 23-5-306 through 23-5-309 and may retain a portion of the 15 consideration paid by participants."
