accumulated in the United States military services or the
merchant marine service satisfactory to the department may
be accepted in lieu of the operating experience required for
licensing of engineers in each of the license
classifications.

(3) An applicant having training in the operation of 6 7 steam or water boilers and steam machinery who has been certified as having satisfactorily completed a prescribed 8 9 training course from a recognized vocational-technical 10 training school or center or other department-approved 11 institution or training program in the classification for 12 which he the applicant is applying may, at the discretion of 13 the department, be credited with a maximum of 6 months' 14 experience toward a first-, second-, or third-class 15 engineer's license or a low-pressure engineer's license."
