Section 1. Section 37-13-104, MCA, is amended to read:

"37-13-104. Partial exemptions. Nothing--in-this This chapter shall may not be construed to require doctors of medicine; --osteopathy; chiropractic, dentistry, and podiatry who are licensed in Montana to take further examinations in anatomy, physiology, chemistry, dermatology, diagnosis, bacteriology, materia medica, or other subjects which that are or may be required for licensure in their respective professions; but no a doctor of medicine; --osteopathy; chiropractic, dentistry, or podiatry shall may not practice acupuncture in this state unless and until he the doctor of chiropractic, dentistry, or podiatry has completed a course and passed an examination in acupuncture as required by this chapter."
