Operating licenses or permits may be issued to any person,

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0375, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION: An act revising the law regarding shooting preserves by removing the 10 mile restriction on preserve location and establishing a flat fee for shooting preserve licenses or permits.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- There are 39 licensed shooting ranges in Montana as of December 31, 1992.
- The average fee paid for a shooting range license or permit was \$92.00.
- The Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks (FWP) assumes five preserves will not relicense because they are not 3. operating preserves -- they only license to protect their rights under the 10 mile limit.
- 4. FWP assumes 10 more preserves will license statewide because of the elimination of the 10-mile restriction.

FISCAL IMPACT: A flat fee for shooting preserves would generate an additional \$7,412 in revenue per year.
