1 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1 2 INTRODUCED BY KENNEDY 3 Δ A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF 5 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA URGING THE 6 DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS, WITH THE ASSISTANCE 7 OF MONTANA CITIZENS, TO TRAP SURPLUS WILD ELK THAT ARE NOT 8 EFFECTIVELY HARVESTED BY HUNTERS AND TRANSPLANT THE ELK TO 9 ELK MANAGEMENT AREAS THAT HAVE NOT REACHED DESIRED POPULATION LEVELS: AND URGING THE FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS 10 11 COMMISSION TO AUTHORIZE THE TRANSPLANTATION OF SURPLUS WILD 12 ELK, SUBJECT TO APPLICABLE LAWS REGULATING TRANSPLANTATION OF WILDLIFE, UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE DEPARTMENT. 13 14 15 WHEREAS, elk are a valuable resource to Montana citizens

16 in numerous ways, including hunting value, wildlife viewing 17 value, economic value, and value as an important species in 18 the state's ecological system; and

19 WHEREAS, while recognizing the value of normal trading 20 of animals with other states for the mutual benefit of 21 Montana citizens and wildlife, the trapping of surplus wild 22 elk that are not harvested by hunters and their 23 transplantation to elk management areas that have not 24 reached desired population levels are preferable to having 25 the surplus wild elk shipped out of state, provided that all

ecological concerns and public benefits are properly
 considered; and

WHEREAS, the trapping and transplantation of surplus
wild elk would provide genetic diversity that would enhance
isolated or scattered elk populations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 That the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks be 10 urged to trap surplus wild elk in excess of the carrying 11 capacity of the habitat that are not necessary to sustain 12 the health and population of a resident herd and that are not harvested by hunting, if the elk can be effectively 13 14 trapped, and transplant the surplus wild elk to an elk 15 management district that is capable of sustaining a viable 16 elk population but that has not reached the desired level of population, such as relocation from the National Bison Range 17 18 to the Ashley Lake area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department be urged to allow the citizens of Montana to assist financially and physically in the relocation of surplus wild elk to underpopulated elk habitats.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fish, Wildlife, and
 Parks Commission be urged to authorize the transplantation
 of surplus wild elk when recommended by the Department,
