| 17 | WHEREAS, unless this epidemic is stopped, millions of |
| 18 | our young people will suffer physically and mentally for the |
| 19 | rest of their lives and many will die of acquired immune |
| 20 | deficiency syndrome (AIDS); and |
| 21 | WHEREAS, the federal government has spent almost \$3 |
| 22 | billion since 1970 to promote contraceptives and "safe sex" |
| 23 | among teenagers, and yet huge numbers of sexually active |
| 24 | teens never use contraceptives or use them improperly; and |
| 25 | WHEREAS, research has shown that the overall failure |

1 rate of condoms due to slippage and breakage is 26% and, although a woman can conceive only 1 or 2 days per month, certain diseases are communicable 365 days a year; and 3 WHEREAS, there is only one way to remain healthy in the midst of this sexual epidemic and that is by abstaining from 6 sexual intercourse or by being faithful to an uninfected 7 partner; and WHEREAS, sex education programs that do not emphasize sexual abstinence are inconsistent with society's concern 9 10 for reducing unwanted pregnancies, AIDS, and other sexually 11 transmitted diseases. 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: (1) That the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Board of Public Education issue educational guidelines that affirm sexual abstinence outside the context of marriage. (2) That the Board of Public Education and each school district board of trustees require a course in sex education that emphasizes that abstinence from sexual intercourse is the only protection that is 100% effective against unwanted pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and AIDS when transmitted sexually. <u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: A joint resolution of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the State of Montana urging all Montana school district boards of trustees to require all public elementary schools, middle schools, and high schools that teach sex education to emphasize abstinence from sexual intercourse as the only effective protection against pregnancy or sexually transmitted diseases.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Curriculum development is the right and responsibility of local school boards.
- 2. The Montana School Accreditation Standards, Rule 10.55.1301, Health Enhancement Program states (1) "In general, a basic health enhancement program shall: (a) Integrate lifestyle management throughout the curriculum; (b) Focus on the total self and the development of responsibility, values, attitudes, and behaviors; (c) Give students decision-making tools for personal health; and (d) Address intellectual, social, emotional, and physical dimensions of healthy lifestyles."
