#### STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0014, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act to establish a limit on the fund balance in the crime victims benefits account; requiring the transfer of at least \$250,000 to the general fund on or before March 31, 1994; and terminating the account balance limitation upon notification of the termination of federal crime victim benefits funds.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. A one-time residual equity transfer of \$250,000 will be made from the crime victims benefits account to the general fund prior to March 31, 1994.
- 2. The fund balance in the crime victims benefits account on March 31, 1994, after the \$250,000 transfer from the account, will be less than \$500,000.
- 3. The fund balance in the crime victims benefits account balance as of March 31, 1995, and subsequent years will not exceed \$500,000.
- 4. Federal crime victims benefit grant funds will be available to the state in FY95 and subsequent years but will not cause the fund balance in the account to exceed the limitation of \$500,000.
- 5. This bill will have no impact on expenditures for crime victims benefits or operating expenses.
