10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 **Section 1.** Section 10-1-604, MCA, is amended to read:

12 "10-1-604. Leave of absence of public employees
13 attending training camp or similar training program. A
14 state, city, town, or county employee who is a member of the
15 organized militia of this state or who is a member of the
16 organized or unorganized reserve corps or military forces of
17 the United States and who has been an employee for a period
18 of 6 months ~~shall~~ must be given leave of absence ~~with--pay~~
19 for a period of time not to exceed 15 working days in a
20 calendar year for attending regular encampments, training
21 cruises, and similar training programs of the organized
22 militia or of the military forces of the United States. This
23 leave ~~may-not-be~~ must be:

24 (1) with pay if the leave is charged against the
25 employee's annual vacation time; or

1 (2) without pay."

2 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. [This act] is
3 effective on passage and approval.
