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House BILL NO. 85 1 2 INTRODUCED BY 3

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING MEMBERS OF 4 THE LEGISLATURE WHO ARE EMPLOYEES OF THE STATE OR ANY LOCAL 5 6 GOVERNMENT ENTITY, SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR SPECIAL TAXING 7 DISTRICT FROM RECEIVING COMPENSATION FROM THE MEMBER'S 8 PUBLIC EMPLOYER FOR EMPLOYMENT MEMBER'S DURING THE 9 LEGISLATIVE SERVICE; AMENDING SECTIONS 5-2-301 AND 5-2-302. 10 MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND AN APPLICABILITY DATE." 11

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

14 Section 1. Section 5-2-301, MCA, is amended to read: 15 "5-2-301. Compensation and expenses for members while 16 in session -- other payment of public employees prohibited. 17 (1) Except as provided in subsection (7), legislators are 18 entitled to a salary commensurate to that of the daily rate 19 of an entry grade 8 classified state employee in effect when 20 the regular session of the legislature in which they serve 21 is convened under 5-2-103 for those days during which the 22 legislature is in session. The president of the senate and 23 the speaker of the house shall receive an additional \$5 a 24 day in salary for those days during which the legislature is 25 in session.

Montana Legislative Counci

Legislators may serve for no salary.

2 (3) Legislators are entitled to \$50 a day, 7 days a
3 week, during a legislative session, as reimbursement for
4 expenses incurred in attending a session. Expense payments
5 shell stop when the legislature recesses for more than 3
6 days and shall resume when the legislature reconvenes.

7 (4) Legislators are entitled to a mileage allowance as 8 provided in 2-18-503 for each mile of travel to the place of 9 the holding of the session and to return to their place of 10 residence at the conclusion of the session.

11 (5) In addition to the mileage allowance provided for 12 in subsection (4), legislators, upon submittal of an 13 appropriate claim for such mileage reimbursement to the 14 office of the legislative council, are entitled to:

15 (a) three additional round trips to their place of 16 residence during each regular session; and

17 (b) such additional round trips as are authorized by18 the legislature during special session.

19 (6) Legislators are not entitled to any additional
20 mileage allowance under subsection (4) for a special session
21 if it is convened within 7 days of a regular session.

(7) In lieu of the salary provided for in subsection
(1) and the expense allowance provided for in subsection
(3), a legislator may receive remuneration for services
performed during a legislative session. A legislator

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choosing to receive remuneration for services performed 1 2 shall file a request to receive payment under this 3 subsection with the accounting office of the legislative 4 council. A legislator exercising the option to receive 5 remuneration for services performed may not receive more remuneration than legislators paid pursuant to subsections 6 7 (1) and (3). Remuneration for services performed must be 8 reduced \$50 a day when the legislature recesses for more 9 than 3 days.

(8) (a) A member of the legislature who receives 10 11 payment pursuant to this section and who is an employee of the state or a county, city, town, school district, special 12 taxing district, or other public entity supported by a tax 13 may not, except as provided in subsection (8)(b), receive 14 15 compensation of any kind from the member's public employer for the period of public employment occurring during the 16 member's legislative service. 17

(b) Subsection (8)(a) does not apply to employees whose
 contract of employment is agreed to or renewed prior to [the
 effective date of this act].

21 (c) For the purpose of this subsection (8), 22 "compensation" includes a salary or hourly wage and 23 reimbursement for expenses but does not include annual or 24 other leave allowed to be taken by the member or 25 compensation paid for services performed before the member's 1 <u>legislative service.</u>"

Section 2. Section 5-2-302, MCA, is amended to read: 2 3 \*5-2-302. Compensation and expenses when legislature 4 not in session -- other payment of public employees prohibited. (1) When the legislature is not in session, a 5 6 member of the legislature, while engaged in legislative 7 business with prior authorization of the appropriate funding 8 authority, is entitled to: 9  $(\pm)$  (a) a mileage allowance as provided in 2-18-503:

12 (3)(c) a salary equal to one full day's pay at the rate of a classified state employee, described in 5-2-301(1) for 13 14 each 24-hour period of time (from midnight to midnight), or 15 portion thereof of the period, spent away from home on authorized legislative business. However, if time spent for 16 17 business other than authorized legislative business results 18 in lengthening a legislator's stay away from home into an 19 additional 24-hour period, he the legislator may not be compensated for the additional day. 20

21 (2) (a) A member of the legislature who receives
22 payment pursuant to this section and who is an employee of
23 the state or a county, city, town, school district, special
24 taxing district, or other public entity supported by a tax
25 may not, except as provided in subsection (2)(b), receive

1	compensation of any kind from the member's public employer
2	for the period of public employment occurring during the
3	member's legislative service.
4	(b) Subsection (2)(a) does not apply to employees whose
5	contract of employment is agreed to or renewed prior to [the
