Section 1. (2) "Osteoporosis" means a bone disease characterized 15 16 by a reduction in bone density accompanied by increasing 17 porosity and brittleness and associated with loss of calcium from the bones. 18 19 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Osteoporosis prevention and 20 education program. (1) The department may establish, 21 maintain an osteoporosis prevention and promote, and 22 education program to promote public awareness of causes of 23 osteoporosis, options for prevention, the value of early 24 detection, and possible treatments (including the benefits 25 and risks of those treatments).

The department shall deposit in the account money received from gifts, grants, bequests, or endowments from 10 public or private sources. The funds must be used to carry 11 out the provisions of [sections 1 through 4]. The money in 12 13 the account may be spent in accordance with a legislative 14 appropriation.

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STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE Form BD-15 In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>HB0088</u>, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION: This act provides for development of an osteoporosis prevention and education program.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- Currently the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences (DHES) does not have sufficient funds or FTE available to implement and manage the program. The department would need one FTE with associated costs of \$33,000 for personal services and \$20,500 for operating expenses to implement and establish this program.
- 2. One year of funds from grants, gifts, bequests and endowments from public and private sources will be accumulated in the state special revenue account established for this program. In January 1995, the department will begin to implement the program if sufficient funds have been donated.

FISCAL IMPACT: No general fund impact. The program would be funded through gifts, grants, bequests and endowments from public or private sources.

<u>TECHNICAL NOTES</u>: No provision for reimbursing an advisory council is made in the bill. This may make it difficult to secure statewide participation as specified. Also, an appropriation of funds from the state special revenue account will need to be made to the department, to implement and operate of this program.
