STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE Form BD-15 In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>SB0043</u>, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION: An act revising the allocation of the distributor's gasoline license tax; reducing the allocation to the snowmobile account from 1/2 of 1 percent to 1/4 of 1 percent; and providing an effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The bill becomes effective July 1, 1994.
- 2. Revenue not being deposited in the Snowmobile Account as a result of passage of this bill will be deposited in the Highway State Special Revenue Fund (Highway Trust Fund). This account funds the Department of Transportation's Federal Aid Highway program at a 87% federal 13% state ratio, a portion of the 100% state funded Reconstruction Trust Fund projects, the State Maintenance program, the Motor Carrier Services program and the General Administration programs. The account also funds portions of the Departments of Justice; Fish, Wildlife and Parks; and Administration.
- 3. Gallonage figures used in the projections are based on ROC figures for gasoline sales.
- 4. The gas tax rate will increased to \$0.27 on July 1, 1994.
