9	WHEREAS, there is proposed legislation in the United

13	WHEREAS, the enactment of federal requirements that must
14	be implemented by the states results in an additional burden
15	for financially troubled states; and
16	WHEREAS, the State of Montana is already in the process
17	of implementing complex requirements for regulation and
18	removal of underground storage tanks; and
19	WHEREAS, the regulation and removal of underground
20	storage tanks have been costly and frustrating to Montana
21	citizens, necessitating extraordinary financial measures to
22	meet the requirements for storage tanks; and
23	WHEREAS, additional federal requirements for aboveground
24	storage tanks would impair the state's ability to address
25	the environmental hazards of storage tanks in an economical

and efficient manner; and
WHEREAS, the State of Montana already has a
comprehensive uniform fire code that regulates the siting
and construction of aboveground storage tanks.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
(1) That the United States Congress be strongly urged
to refrain from imposing on aboveground storage tanks new
standards and restrictions that must be implemented by the
states.
(2) That copies of this resolution be sent by the
Secretary of State to the President of the United States,
the United States Congress, and the Montana Congressional
Delegation.
