5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT APPROPRIATING MONEY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL
6 RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION FOR GRANTS FOR DESIGNATED PROJECTS UNDER THE
7 RECLAMATION AND DEVELOPMENT GRANTS PROGRAM; PRIORITIZING GRANTS AND AMOUNTS;
8 ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR GRANTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Appropriations for reclamation and development grants.** (1) The grants listed in [section 2] are appropriated to the department of natural resources and conservation from the reclamation and development grants special revenue account from funds allocated for appropriation of the interest income of the resource indemnity trust fund set forth in Title 15, chapter 38, with the exception of those allocations made in 15-38-202 and 75-1-1101.

17 (2) The funds appropriated in this section must be awarded by the department to the entities listed
18 in [section 2] for the prescribed purposes and in the prescribed grant amounts, subject to the conditions
19 provided in [sections 2 through 4].

21 **NEW SECTION. Section 2. Approved grant projects.** (1) The legislature approves the grants listed
22 in subsection (2), to be made in the order of priority as indicated within the following list of projects and
23 activities. If the conditions in [sections 3 and 4] are met, funds must be awarded up to the amounts
24 approved in this section in order of priority until available funds are expended. Funds not accepted by
25 grantees or funds not used by higher-ranked projects and activities must be provided for projects and
26 activities lower on the priority list that would otherwise not receive funding. Descriptions of the various
27 projects and activities and specific conditions established for each project and activity are contained within
28 the department of natural resources and conservation reclamation and development grants program report
29 to the 54th legislature for the 1997 biennium.

30 **NEW SECTION. Section 4. Condition of grants.** Disbursement of grant funds under [sections 1

1 through 6] is subject to the following conditions that must be met by the project sponsor:

2 (1) A scope of work and budget for the project must be approved by the department of natural
3 resources and conservation. Reduction in a scope of work or budget may not affect priority activities or
4 improvements.

5 (2) Other funds required for project completion must have been committed, and the commitment
6 must be documented.

7 (3) The project sponsor shall show satisfactory completion of conditions described in the
8 recommendations section of the project narrative of the reclamation and development grants program report
9 for the 1997 biennium.

10 (4) An agreement between the department and the grant applicant must be executed in a timely
11 manner, taking into consideration any changed conditions or circumstances that govern the administration
12 and disbursement of funds.

13 (5) Any other specific requirements considered necessary by the department must be met to
14 accomplish the purpose of the grant as evidenced from the application to the department or as defined by
15 the legislature.
