5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC
6 PROJECT GRANT AWARDS; APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC GRANTS; AND
7 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10
11 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation of cultural and aesthetic grant funds -- priority of
12 disbursement. (1) The Montana arts council shall award grants for projects authorized by and limited to
13 the amounts appropriated by this section. Money must be disbursed in priority order, first to projects
14 covered under subsection (2), second to the project listed in subsection (3), and third to the projects listed
15 in subsection (4). The Montana arts council shall disburse money to projects authorized by this section
16 through grant contracts between the Montana arts council and the grant recipient. The award contract
17 must bind the parties to conditions, if any, listed with the appropriation in subsection (4).

18 (2) Money in the cultural and aesthetic projects account is insufficient in the biennium ending June
19 30, 1995, to fund projects in the amount for which they were approved. All grants not already disbursed
20 at the time of the shortfall have been reduced by 26.68%. If the money in the cultural and aesthetic
21 projects account is insufficient in the biennium ending June 30, 1995, to fund those projects in the amount
22 of the reduced grant for which they were approved, the approved amount for the projects is reappropriated
23 from the account until money has been disbursed to fully cover the grant awards as reduced.

24 (3) There is appropriated to the Montana historical society \$15,000 for the biennium ending July
25 1, 1997, for care and conservation of capitol complex artwork. This appropriation is recommended to be
26 repeated for three successive bienniums and to be reviewed in fiscal year 2001 to determine if it should
27 continue.

28 (4) The following projects are approved and amounts appropriated to the Montana arts council for

14 appropriations made in subsection (4) to the Montana arts council for project evaluations. The evaluations
15 must be done after July 1, 1996, and results must be included in a report on the projects funded by
16 subsections (1) through (4) to be submitted to the 55th legislature.

17
18 **NEW SECTION. Section 2. Reversion of granted money.** (1) On October 1, 1996, money
19 reappropriated in [section 1(2)] but not disbursed reverts to the cultural and aesthetic projects account
20 provided for in 15-35-108.

21 (2) On July 1, 1997, the unencumbered balance of the 1997 biennium grants reverts to the cultural
22 and aesthetic project account provided for in 15-35-108.

24 **NEW SECTION. Section 3. Pro rata reduction of grant awards.** If money in the cultural and
25 aesthetic project account is insufficient to fund projects at the appropriation levels contained in [section
26 1(4)], the Montana arts council shall allocate the available money on a pro rata basis to the authorized
27 projects.

29 **NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date.** [This act] is effective July 1, 1995.



11 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation of cultural and aesthetic grant funds -- priority of

21 projects account is insufficient in the biennium ending June 30, 1995, to fund those projects in the amount
22 of the reduced grant for which they were approved, the approved amount for the projects is reappropriated
23 from the account until money has been disbursed to fully cover the grant awards as reduced.

24 (3) There is appropriated to the Montana historical society \$15,000 for the biennium ending July
25 1, 1997, for care and conservation of capitol complex artwork. This appropriation is recommended to be
26 repeated for three successive bienniums and to be reviewed in fiscal year 2001 to determine if it should
27 continue.
