0	STATEMENT OF INTENT		
1	This bill requires a statement of intent because it authorizes the board of barbers to impose		
2	administrative fines on and recover costs from individuals violating certain provisions of law and		
3	administrative rules governing the practice of barbers. Costs may not be recovered unless the licensee		
4	stipulates to a violation of a provision of law or administrative rule or the licensee, pursuant to a hearing,		
5	has been found to have violated a provision of law or administrative rule.

17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9	Section 1. Section 37-30-502, MCA, is amended to read:		
20	"37-30-502. Refusal, suspension, or revocation of license. (1) The board may, after notice and		
21	opportunity for a hearing, refuse to issue or renew or may suspend or revoke the license of a barber or the		
22	license of any barbershop, barber school, or college for any of the following acts of a licensee:		
23	(1)(a) the violation of any of the provisions of 37-30-308; 37-30-403, except subsection		
24	37-30-403(1)(f); 37-30-406; 37-30-407; 37-30-412; 37-30-413; or 37-30-421;		
25	(2) malpractice or incompetency;		
26	(3)(b) continued practice by a person knowingly having an infectious or contagious disease;		
27	(4)(c) advertising by means of knowingly false or deceptive statements;		
28	(5)(d) advertising, practicing, or attempting to practice under a trade name other than one's own;		
29	(6)(e) habitual drunkenness or addiction to the use of morphine, cocaine, or other habit forming		
30	illegal drugs; or		



1	$\frac{(7)(f)}{(f)}$ the violation of any of the rules adopted pursuant to 37-30-203, including rules defining
2	unprofessional conduct.
3	(2) The board may impose an administrative fine not to exceed \$1,000 for each violation of this
4	chapter or rule adopted pursuant to this chapter, subject to the contested case procedures of the Montana
5	Administrative Procedure Act. If a licensee does not request a hearing or pay the fine within 20 days'
6	notice of the fine, the board may suspend the licensee's license until the fine is paid.
7	(3) Upon a finding of a violation of this chapter or a rule adopted pursuant to this chapter, the
8	board may assess and recover from a licensee its reasonable costs for any proceeding initiated under this
9	section. The board may suspend the licensee's license until the costs are paid if the licensee fails to pay
10	the costs within 20 days' notice of the costs."

# Fiscal Note for HB0033, as introduced

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act authorizing the Board of Barbers to impose administrative fines on and recover costs from individuals violating certain provisions of law and administrative rules governing the practice of barbers.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- It is anticipated that five formal disciplinary actions per year will result in the imposition of administrative fines at an average of \$500 per incident, and the revenue will be deposited in the Board of Barbers state special revenue account.
- 2. The current budget for the Board of Barbers provides for contested hearings. Therefore no additional impact on expenditures is anticipated.
- 3. Assume that the cost-recovery provision in this bill will provide revenues that offset costs producing no fiscal impact.
