13	Section 1. Section 2-6-109, MCA, is amended to read:
14	"2-6-109. Prohibition on distribution or sale of mailing lists exceptions penalty. (1) Except
15	as provided in subsections (3) through (7) (6), in order to protect the privacy of those who deal with state
16	and local government:
17	(a) no an agency may not distribute or sell for use as a mailing list any list of persons without first
18	securing the permission of those on the list; and
19	(b) $\frac{1}{100}$ a list of persons prepared by the agency may $\frac{1}{100}$ be used as a mailing list except by the
20	agency or another agency without first securing the permission of those on the list.
21	(2) As used in this section, "agency" means any board, bureau, commission, department, division,
22	authority, or officer of the state or a local government.
23	(3) Except as provided in 30-9-403, this section does not prevent an individual from compiling a
24	mailing list by examination of original documents or applications which that are otherwise open to public
25	inspection.
26	(4) This section does not apply to the lists of registered electors and the new voter lists provided
27	for in 13-2-115 and 13-38-103, to lists of the names of employees governed by Title 39, chapter 31, or
28	to lists of persons holding driver's licenses provided for under 61-5-126.
29	(5) This section shall not prevent an agency from providing a list to persons providing prolicensing
30	or continuing educational courses subject to Title 20, chapter 30, or specifically exempted therefrom as

2	(6)(5) This section does not apply to the right of access either by Montana law enforcemen
3	agencies or, by purchase or otherwise, of public records dealing with motor vehicle registration.
4	(7)(6) This section does not apply to a corporate information list developed by the secretary o
5	state containing the name, address, registered agent, officers, and directors of business, nonprofit
6	religious, professional, and close corporations authorized to do business in this state.
7	(8)(7) A person violating the provisions of subsection (1)(b) is guilty of a misdemeanor."
