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14	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Pension trust fund established restrictions on use. (1) A pension
15	trust fund is established and maintained for payment of claims and benefits provided under the Volunteer
16	Firefighters' Compensation Act and the volunteer firefighters' pension plan.
17	(2) Except as provided in this section, a member or an employee of the department or the board
18	of investments may not:
19	(a) have any interest, direct or indirect, in the making of any investment or in the gains or profits
20	accruing from the pension trust fund;
21	(b) directly or indirectly, for the member or employee or as an agent or partner of others, borrow
22	from the pension trust fund or deposits;
23	(c) in any manner use the pension trust fund except to make current and necessary payments that
24	are authorized by the division; or
25	(d) become an endorser or surety as to or in any manner an obligor for investments for the pension
26	trust fund.
27	(3) The assets of the pension trust fund may not be used for or diverted to any purpose other than
28	for the exclusive benefit of members, their surviving spouses, their dependent children, and qualified fire
2 9	companies and for paying the reasonable administrative expenses of administering this chapter.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Employment of actuary -- biennial investigation. (1) The board shall
 retain a competent actuary who is an enrolled member of the American academy of actuaries and who is
 familiar with public pension systems. The actuary is the technical adviser to the board on matters regarding
 the actuarial funding of the pension trust fund.

5 (2) The board shall require the actuary to make a biennial actuarial valuation of the assets and 6 liabilities of the pension trust fund. The actuarial valuation must include the sufficiency of the fund to pay 7 full and partial benefits to members and benefit recipients and must include recommendations for any 8 changes that should be made to those benefits or the contributions to the pension trust fund to ensure the 9 actuarial soundness of the pension trust fund.

10 (3) The board shall require the actuary to conduct periodic actuarial experience studies of the 11 pension trust fund and to recommend any changes in actuarial assumptions or tables based upon the 12 studies.

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14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Credit for service as volunteer firefighter. (1) The annual period of 15 service that may be credited under this chapter is the fiscal year. A fractional part of a year may not count 16 toward the service required for participation in this system. To be eligible to receive credit for any particular 17 year, a volunteer firefighter shall serve with a single fire company throughout the entire fiscal year.

18 (2) The years of service are cumulative and need not be continuous. Separate periods of service
properly credited with different fire companies in different fire districts must be credited toward a member's
eligibility for full or partial benefits.

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(3) A volunteer firefighter must receive credit for service during any fiscal year if:

(a) during the fiscal year, the volunteer firefighter completes a minimum of 30 hours of instruction
 in matters pertaining to firefighting under a formal program that has been formulated, supervised, and
 certified to the division by the chief or foreman of the fire company;

(b) the fire company maintained firefighting equipment that is in serviceable condition and that is
valued at \$25,000 or more; and

(c) the fire company or the fire district served by it was rated in class 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, or 10 by the
board of fire underwriters for the purpose of fire insurance premium rates.

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Fiscal Note for <u>HB0063</u>, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act generally revising laws relating to the volunteer firefighters' compensation act; providing for actuarially funded benefits; and revising the monthly pension amounts accordingly.

ASSUMPTIONS :

- 1. The current volunteer firefighters' compensation fund is structured on a "pay-as-yougo" basis which does not take into consideration factors such as projections of changes in benefit payments or investment earnings in determining the ability to sustain established pension benefits given established pension revenues in the long term.
- 2. Current law terminates pension benefits paid from the volunteer firefighters' compensation fund on July 1, 1995.
- 3. There would be an estimated 703 recipients of pension/disability benefits in FY96 and an estimated 717 recipients in FY97 with average service of 17.5 years.
- 4. Current pension and disability benefits are established at \$120 per month. HB0063 would revise the monthly pension and disability benefit to \$100 per month.
- 5. The revenue estimates adopted by the Revenue Oversight Committee assume the allocation of insurance premiums taxes would continue through the 1997 biennium. Hence, the proposal will not affect general fund revenues.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Relative to current law for the 1997 biennium and thereafter, HB0063 would reauthorize benefit payments which would otherwise terminate, although at a lower level.

At current pension/disability levels, benefit payments would be an estimated \$885,780 in FY96 and \$921,488 in FY97. At the revised pension/disability benefit levels contained in HB0063, benefit payments would be an estimated \$738,150 in FY96 and \$767,907 in FY97, a reduction of \$147,630 in FY96 and by \$153,581 in FY97.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES: None.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

The change in monthly pension and disability benefits from \$120 per month to \$100 per month will cause current contributions (5% of insurance premium tax revenues--approximately \$770,000 in FY94) to be deemed adequate to fund pension benefits on an actuarial basis. Maintaining the existing benefit level at \$120 per month would cause the fund to be actuarially unsound unless contributions to the fund were increased.
