Fiscal Note for HB0077, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION: An act requiring a school district to waive tuition for a child who is defined as a homeless child under the federal Stewart B. McKinney Act.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The most recent data collected by the Office of Public Instruction (1993) indicates that there are 2,028 school age children who are homeless. Of these, 1839 are enrolled in public schools.
- 2. The homeless students who are enrolled in the public schools are currently generating ANB funding.

FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal impact to the state.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

There will be shifts in costs at the school district level for those districts which have assessed tuition for homeless students in the past that will no longer be able to do so. In many cases, school districts educating homeless students have not been able to identify a sending district against which to charge tuition.
