16	(a) has worked in the home for at least 3 years providing unpaid household services for family
17	members as an adult primarily without remuneration to care for the home and family and for that reason
18	has diminished marketable skills;
19	(b) is not gainfully employed or is underemployed has been dependent on public assistance or on
20	the income of a relative but is no longer supported by that income;
21	(c) has had or would have difficulty securing paid employment is a parent whose youngest
22	dependent child will become ineligible to receive assistance under the program for aid to families with
23	dependent children pursuant to Title 53, chapter 4, part 2, within 2 years of the parent's application for
24	displaced homemaker assistance; and
25	(d) was dependent on the income of another family member but is no longer supported by such
26	income, was dependent on federal assistance but is no longer eligible for such assistance, or whose
27	eligibility for such federal assistance will be terminated within 6 months is unemployed or underemployed
28	and is experiencing difficulty in obtaining any employment or suitable employment, as appropriate; or
