10	(3) Failure on the part of a registrant to renew his the certificate biennially prior to the expiration
11	date does not deprive him the registrant of the right of renewal; however, a registrant who fails to pay the
12	renewal fee for an additional year of the biennium shall be is considered a new applicant and is required
13	to submit a new application.
14	(4) The fee for any registrant who fails to renew his the certificate prior to the expiration date shall
15	must be increased by an amount not to exceed 50% of his the renewal fee. Renewal may not be

3	(6) Before issuing an order under this section, the board shall provide the person written notice and
4	the opportunity to request, within 30 days of a notice issued by the beard, a hearing on the record.
5	(7) The beard may issue subpoenes to compel the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the
6	disclosure of evidence and may request the attorney general to bring an action to enforce a subpoena.
7	(8) - A person penalized under this section may appeal to the district court.
8	(9) An order, not paid within 30 days of entry, may be enforced in the same manner as a district
9	court money judgment."
