Fiscal Note for HB0228, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act submitting the qualified electors of Montana an amendment to article IV, section 8, article VI, sections 1,2,3,4,6 and 7, and article X, sections 4 and 9, of the Montana Constitution to replace the state board of education, the board of public education, and the superintendent of public instruction with a department of education and a state education advisory commission; removing the superintendent of public instruction as a member of the board of land commissions;

ASSUMPTIONS :

- 1. If the electors of the State of Montana approve the constitutional initiative proposed in House Bill 228, the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction will be eliminated as of January 1, 2001.
- 2. The elected official will be replaced by a director of a state department of education and an assistant director of K-12 education.
- 3. There will no longer a chief state school officer serving on the state land board.

FISCAL IMPACT: No impact for the 1997 biennium. The current budget for staff in the Office of Public Instruction is \$4.8 million per year.

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1	Section 2. Article VI, section 1, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
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4	(2) Each holds office for a term of four years which begins on the first Monday of January next
5	succeeding election, and until a successor is elected and qualified.
6	(3) Each shall reside at the seat of government, there keep the public records of his office, and
7	perform such other duties as are provided in this constitution and by law."
8	
9	Section 3. Article VI, section 2, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
10	"Section 2. Election. (1) The governor, licutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general,
11	superintendent of public instruction, and auditor shall be elected by the qualified electors at a general
12	election provided by law.
13	(2) Each candidate for governor shall file jointly with a candidate for licutenant governor in primary
14	elections, or so otherwise comply with nomination procedures provided by law that the offices of governor
15	and-lieutenant governor are voted upon together in primary and general elections."
16	
17	Section 4. Article VI, section 3, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
18	"Section 3. Qualifications. (1) No person shall be eligible to the office of governor, lieutenant
19	governer, searctary of state, attorney general, superintendent of public instruction, or auditor unless he is
20	25 years of age or older at the time of his election. In addition, each shall be a citizen of the United States
21	who has resided within the state two years next preceding his election.
22	(2) Any person with the forogoing qualifications is eligible to the office of attorney general if an
23	attorney in good standing admitted to practice law in Montana who has engaged in the active practice
24	thereof for at least five years before election.
25	(3) The superintendent of public instruction shall have such educational qualifications as are
26	provided by law."

28	Section 5. Article VI, section 4, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
29	"Section 4. Dutics. (1) The executive power is vested in the governor who shall see that the laws
30	are faithfully executed. He shall have such other duties as are provided in this constitution and by law.



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1	(2) The lieutenant governor shall perform the duties provided by law and these delegated to him
2	by the governor. No power specifically vested in the governor by this constitution may be delegated to the
3	lieutenant governør.
4	(3) The secretary of state shall maintain official records of the executive branch and of the acts
5	of the legislature, as provided by law. He shall keep the great seal of the state of Montana and perform any
6	other duties provided by law.
7	(4) The atterney general is the legal officer of the state and shall have the duties and powers
8	provided by law.
9	(5) The superintendent of public instruction and the auditor shall have such duties as are provided
10	by law."

12	Section 6. Article VI, section 6, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
13	"Section 6. Vacancy in office. (1) If the office of licutenant governor becomes vacant by his
14	succession to the office of governer, or by his death, resignation, or disability as determined by law, the
15	governor shall appoint a qualified person to serve in that office for the remainder of the term. If both the
16	elected governor and the elected lieutenant governor become unable to serve in the office of governor,
17	succession to the respective offices shall be as provided by law for the period until the next general
18	election. Then, a governor and lisutenant governor shall be elected to fill the romainder of the original term.
19	(2) If the office of secretary of state, attorney general, <u>or</u>-auditor, or superintendent of public
20	instruction becomes vacant by death, resignation, or disability as determined by law, the governor shall
21	appoint a qualified person to serve in that office until the next general election and until a successor is
22	elected and qualified. The person elected to fill a vacancy shall hold the office until the expiration of the
23	term for which his prodocessor was elected."

25	Section 7. Article VI, section 7, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amonded to read:
26	"Section 7. 20 departments. All executive and administrative offices, boards, bureaus,
27	commissions, agencies and instrumentalities of the executive branch (except for the office of governor,
28	lieutonant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, superintendent of public instruction, and auditor)
29	and their respective functions, powers, and duties, shall be allocated by law among not more than 20
30	principal departments so as to provide an orderly arrangement in the administrative organization of state



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1	government. Temporary commissions may be established by law and need not be allocated within a
2	department."

4	Section 8. Article X, section 4, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
5	"Section 4. Board of land commissioners. The governor, superintendent of public instruction,
6	auditor, socretary of state, and attorney-general constitute the board of land commissioners. It has the
7	authority to direct, control, lease, exchange, and sell school lands and lands which have been or may be
8	granted for the support and benefit of the various state educational institutions, under such regulations and
9	restrictions as may be provided by law."
10	
11	Section 1. Article X, section 9, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:
12	"Section 9. Boards Department of education state education advisory commission board of
13	regents. (1) There is a state board of education composed of the board of regents of higher education and
14	the beard of public education. It is responsible for long range planning, and for coordinating and evaluating
15	policies and programs for the state's educational systems. It shall submit unified budget requests
16	department of education, with a director appointed by the governor. The department and the director shall
17	have duties assigned by law.
18	(2) There is a state education advisory commission, consisting of eight members appointed BY THE

2	(c) The board shall appoint a commissioner of higher education and prescribe his term and dutie

6	system and such other public educational institutions as may be assigned by law. Other duties of the bea

12	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date — applicability. If approved by the electorate, th
