15	satisfied the provisions of this chapter, the commissioner shall immediately notify the person of the
16	noncompliance. If the person fails to comply after the notification, the commissioner may issue an order
17	of noncompliance as provided in this section.
18	(2) Such an An order of noncompliance shall may be issued when:
19	(a) upon examination of the official ballot, it appears that the person has failed to file a statement
20	or report as required by this chapter or that a statement or report filed by a person does not conform to
21	law; or
22	(b) it is determined that a statement or report filed with the commissioner does not conform to the
23	requirements of this chapter or that a person has failed to file a statement or report required by law.
24	(2)(3) If an order of noncompliance is issued during a campaign period or within 60 days after an
25	election, a candidate or political committee shall submit the necessary information within 5 days after
26	receiving the notice order of noncompliance. Upon a failure to submit the required information within the
27	time specified, the appropriate county attorney or the commissioner may initiate a civil or criminal action
28	pursuant to the procedures outlined in 13-37-124 and 13-37-125.
29	(3)(4) If an order of noncompliance is issued during any period other than that described in
30	subsection (2) (3), a candidate or political committee shall submit the necessary information within 10 days





after receiving the notice <u>order</u> of noncompliance. Upon a failure to submit the required information within the time specified, the appropriate county attorney or the commissioner shall initiate a civil or criminal action pursuant to the procedures outlined in 13-37-124 and 13-37-125."
