## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act clarifying current creditable service purchase provisions of the Teachers' Retirement System.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Members who became members of the Teachers' Retirement System before July 1, 1989, will continue to be eligible to purchase the same type and number of years of creditable service as under current law.
- Members who became members of the Teachers' Retirement System after July 1, 1989, will have new rights to purchase additional service for: out-of-state teaching, private teaching, service while on leave, and time spent on an injury-related leave. Members after July 1, 1989, will pay the actuarial cost to purchase additional service; therefore, the purchase will not create any unfunded liabilities to the Teachers' Retirement System.
- 3. The computer system enhancement necessary cost to implement these provisions will not exceed \$3,600.

(2) (a) For each year of service to be credited, a member who became a member before July 1, 1989, shall contribute to the retirement system an amount equal to the combined employer and employee contribution for his the member's first full year's teaching salary earned after becoming a member of the retirement system or after returning to the retirement system, whichever is later, for each year of creditable service plus interest at the rate the contribution would have carned had the contribution been in his account upon the completion of 5 years of membership service.
