10	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Licensure by endorsement. An applicant who satisfies the
11	requirements of this section may be granted a certificate of registration at the discretion of the board
12	without examination. An applicant who meets the qualifications set forth in 37-10-302 may request
13	licensure based on the applicant's credentials as long as the applicant:
14	(1) files an application under oath on forms supplied by the board;
15	(2) furnishes satisfactory proof to the board that the applicant has been licensed by examination
16	in another state that has qualifications equal to or exceeding those required in this state;
17	(3) provides proof to the board that the applicant possesses a doctor of optometry degree from
18	a school or college approved and accredited by the board and that the degree was obtained after
19	completion of a course of study as required in 37-10-302; and
20	(4) has been actively engaged in the practice of optometry in any state or in federal service for 5
21	consecutive years immediately prior to the year in which application is made.

23	Section 2. Section 37-10-304, MCA, is amended to read:
24	"37-10-304. Course in use of diagnostic and therapeutic drugs required. (1) (a) In addition to the
25	requirements of 37-10-302 or 37-10-303, whichover is applicable , each person desiring to commence the
26	practice of optometry shall satisfactorily complete a course prescribed by the board of medical examiners $_{\star}$
27	with consultation and approval by the board of optometrists, with particular emphasis on the topical
28	application of diagnostic agents to the eye for the purpose of examination of the human eye and the
29	analysis of ocular functions.
30	(b) A person presently licensed to practice optometry who wishes to employ diagnostic agents

must is required to satisfactorily complete a course referred to in subsection (1)(a) and must is required to
 pass an examination as provided in subsection (1)(d).

- 3 (c) The course referred to in subsection (1)(a) must be conducted by an institution accredited by
 a regional or professional accreditation organization which that is recognized or approved by the national
 commission on accrediting or the United States commissioner of education. The course must also be
 approved by the board.
- 7 (d) The board shall provide for an examination in competency in the use of diagnostic drugs and
 8 shall issue a certificate to those applicants who pass such the examination.
- 9 (2) (a) In addition to the requirements of 37-10-302 or 37-10-303, whichever is applicable, each 10 person desiring to commence the practice of optometry shall:
- (i) pass an examination, of the international association of boards of examiners in optometry, on
 the diagnosis, treatment, and management of ocular disease; or

(ii) take a course and pass an examination in the diagnosis, treatment, and management of ocular diseases. The course and examination must be conducted by an institution accredited by a regional or professional accreditation organization which that is recognized or approved by the national commission on accrediting or the United States commissioner of education. The course and examination must also be approved by the board.

(b) A person presently licensed to practice optometry who wishes to employ therapeutic
pharmaceutical agents must meet the requirements of subsection (2)(a).

(i) provide for an examination in competency in the diagnosis, treatment, and management of
 therapeutic pharmaceutical agents; and

25 Section 3. Section 37-10-308, MCA, is amended to read:

26 "37-10-308. Continuing education required for license renewal. An optometrist licensed pursuant
to 37-10-302 or 37-10-303 is required to attend not less than 12 hours annually of scientific clinics,
forums, or optometric educational studies as may be provided or approved by the board as a prerequisite
for license renewal. A copy of this section must be sent to each licensee by the department prior to the
license renewal date each year. The board may exempt from this requirement those licensees who submit

satisfactory proof that they were prevented from attending educational programs during the preceding year 1 due to illness or for other good reason." 2 3 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Repealer.
