THE STATEMENT MUST MEET THE SPECIFICATIONS DESCRIBED IN 18-7-306, AND THE COSTS MUST BE ESTIMATED BASED ON THE FACTORS LISTED IN 18-7-307. DOCUMENTATION OF THE COST OF PUBLICATION MUST BE FILED WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF POLITICAL PRACTICES.
