8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10	Section 1. Section 53-24-215, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"53-24-215. Certification of chemical dependency counselors. (1) The department shall grant
12	certification to practice as a certified chemical dependency counselor to any person who successfully
13	completes a competency examination that must include a written exam, an oral exam, and a review of a
14	taped work sample, as meets the eligibility requirements and competency standards defined in rules adopted
15	under 53-24-204.
16	(2) A person may apply for certification as a certified chemical dependency counselor if he:
17	(a) has:
18	(i) received a baccalaureate degree in alcohol and drug studies, psychology, sociology, social work,
19	counseling, or a related field from an accredited college or university;
20	(ii) received an associate of arts degree in alcohol and drug studies, chemical dependency, or
21	substance abuse from an accredited institution; or
22	(iii) successfully completed at least 1 year of formalized training in chemical dependency counseling
23	in a program approved by the department or recognized under the laws of another state; and
24	(b) has completed 2,000 hours of supervised work experience in chemical dependency counseling
25	in a state approved chemical dependency treatment program, an internship supervised by the college or
26	university and endorsed by the department, or a similar program recognized under the laws of another
27	state. Work experience must include experience in 12 core-function areas, including screening, intake,
28	orientation, assessment, treatment planning, individual and group counseling, case management, crisis
29	intervention, client education, referral, recordkeeping, and consultation with other professionals in regard
