- (i) prior to the school fiscal year for which the transfer is budgeted, the trustees have established by resolution, in the manner provided for in subsection (3)(b), a long-range plan for the use of the money within the authorized purposes of the building reserve;
- (ii) the amount has been budgeted in the general fund for the school fiscal year in which the transfer is made;
- (III) THE AMOUNT DOES NOT EXCEED THE AMOUNT BY WHICH THE ADOPTED GENERAL FUND
  BUDGET EXCEEDS THE BASE BUDGET AMOUNT FOR THE DISTRICT; and
  - (iii)(IV) the transfer is made by December MARCH 31 of the school fiscal year.
