12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
13	
14	Section 1. Section 87-1-605, MCA, is amended to read:
15	"87-1-605. Fees used to purchase recreational facilities. (1) One dollar of the fee for Class A
16	resident fishing license, \$1 of the fee for Class B-4 nonresident 5-day fishing license, and \$5 of the fee for
17	the Class B nonresident fishing license shall <u>must</u> be used for the purchase, operation, development, and
18	maintenance of fishing accesses; stream, river, and lake frontages; and the land deemed considered
19	necessary to provide recreational use thereof of fishing accesses and frontages.
20	(2) The amount of funds used for operation , development, and maintenance may not exceed 25%
21	of the monoys must equal at least 50% of the money set aside each year under this section and must be
22	expended as provided in subsection (3). The funds raised under this section may not be used in lieu of any
23	funds or sources of funds currently being used for acquisition or purchase of fishing accesses, stream, river,
24	or lake frontages and the land deemed <u>considered</u> necessary to provide recreational use thereof <u>of fishing</u>
25	accesses and frontages but serve in addition to those funds. The moneys money used for operation,
26	development, and maintenance may be used only for these purposes on lands acquired with funds under
27	this section after April 30, 1974.
28	(3) Operation and maintenance money set aside each year under this section must be expended
29	based on the following priority:
30	(a) weed management;

4	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Report to legislature. Because [Section 1] terminates July 1, 1999, the
5	department of fish, wildlife, and parks shall report to the 56th legislature by December 1, 1998, regarding
6	the success of the operation and maintenance program required by [Section 1] and on the status of weed
7	management and streambank restoration at fishing access sites and frontages.
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9	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 1995.

11	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Termination. [This act] terminates July 1, 1999.

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STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Fiscal Note for <u>HB0512</u>, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act requiring at least 50 percent of fishing license funds allocated for operation and maintenance of fishing access sites and stream, river, and lake frontages be prioritized and expended for weed control, streambank restoration, and general operation and maintenance; requiring a report on program success to the 56th legislature; and providing an effective date and a termination date.

ASSUMPTIONS :

- 1. The act is effective July 1, 1995 and terminates on July 1, 1999.
- 2. The Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks will report to the 56th Legislature by December 1, 1998, regarding the success of the operation and maintenance program and on the status of weed management and streambank restoration at fishing access sites and frontages.
- 3. Revenues will continue to be approximately \$400,000 per year.
- 4. Funding available for fishing access site acquisitions will be reduced by \$100,000 (from \$300,000 per year to \$200,000) and operations and maintenance will increase by \$100,000 (from \$100,000 per year to \$200,000).
- 5. The fishing access site program currently acquires 2 to 3 sites per year. Under this proposal, acquisitions may decline and the long-range building program acquisition plan would be reduced.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There will be no change in projected revenues or expenditures. Emphasis on how the funds are expended will change from acquisition to weed control, streambank restoration, and general operation and maintenance.
