1	Section 1. Section 50-51-102, MCA, is amended to read:

STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Fiscal Note for HB0573, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act exempting tourist homes that rent or lease accommodations for 30 days or fewer per year from licensure.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Executive Budget present law base serves as the starting point from which to calculate any fiscal impact due to this proposed legislation.
- 2. There is no way to determine how many tourist home licenses would become exempt because of this definition change. Licensure records do not currently record this type of information. Therefore, little or virtually no fiscal impact is assumed.
- 3. Licenses are issued for a one-year time frame. The department assumes that the establishments which have already received their licenses for the 1995 year, and which become exempt under this legislation, will be entitled to a refund of their license fee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Minimal impact (please see assumptions #2 and #3 above).

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

Any local health agency inspections already completed during calendar year 1995 on the newly-exempted establishments could be unfunded through license fee reimbursements if the fee is refunded. (Please see assumption # 3 above.)

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This legislation could create a situation where unlicensed tourist homes are in competition with licensed tourist homes. (As an example, a tourist home could operate on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday through an entire summer, and be exempt from licensure.) Effects on long-term public health would need to be evaluated with the evolving tourism emphasis in Montana to determine future impact.

TECHNICAL NOTES:

Section 2 gives an immediate effective date upon passage and approval. The department would need to determine which establishments were issued 1995 tourist home licenses, that would now be exempt from licensure, and issue license fee refunds. An October 1, 1995, effective date would eliminate this requirement. (Please see assumption #3.)
