4 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF  
5 MONTANA ENCOURAGING COLLABORATION AMONG PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND LOCAL HUMAN SERVICE  
6 AGENCIES IN THE PROVISION OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES.

8        WHEREAS, the universal need for transportation services in Montana is an unavoidable consequence  
9        of the unique and rich lifestyle enjoyed by a population of approximately 856,000 persons distributed  
10       throughout 147,138 square miles of plains and mountains; and

11 WHEREAS, numerous local human service agencies, including public schools, senior citizens  
12 centers, organizations providing services to the developmentally disabled, and transit authorities, have  
13 historically maintained transportation systems in order to provide services to their constituents; and

14 WHEREAS, tax-supported resources are limited; and

15 WHEREAS, tax-supported service agencies are finding it increasingly difficult to maintain historic  
16 levels of services; and

17 WHEREAS, given adequate planning and coordinating, transportation resources could be shared by  
18 human service agencies without compromising service.

20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE  
21 STATE OF MONTANA:

22 That public schools and community-based, tax-supported human service agencies be encouraged  
23 to collaborate in the provision of transportation services whenever possible, within the confines of law and  
24 recognized safety standards and practices.

25           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that local, state, and federal entities that are responsible for the  
26 regulation and funding of local human service agencies be encouraged to review and to remove any laws,  
27 regulations, and policies not related to passenger safety that may hinder or prohibit collaboration among  
28 transportation service providers.
