9	WHEREAS, Montana's system of higher education has provided numerous benefits to the citizens
10	of Montana; and
11	WHEREAS, the educational needs of the world are becoming increasingly more complex and
12	dependent on technological knowledge; and
13	WHEREAS, Montana's citizens will become increasingly more dependent on higher education
14	programs in order to remain competitive in the job market of this changing world; and
15	WHEREAS, the cost of tuition for higher education in Montana has increased by 155% in real
16	dollars over the last 10 years, while state support for higher education has decreased by 7% in real dollars;
17	and
18	WHEREAS, students in higher education in Montana and their families are not only contributing to
19	the tax increases necessary to support higher education, but students and their families are also paying the
20	increased costs of tuition, resulting in a significantly larger contribution to higher education funding in this
21	state than that of many other citizens; and
22	WHEREAS, an increasing percentage of the students in Montana's university system units are
23	nontraditional students who have returned to school while attempting to maintain a job and a family; and
24	WHEREAS, due to the ever-escalating cost of in-state tuition, higher education is becoming less
25	accessible to young people and nontraditional students in Montana, especially those with limited resources.

27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
28	STATE OF MONTANA:
29	That the Board of Regents be requested to study the following issues:
30	(1) limitation of future increases in tuition and fees;
