- 30 (b) streamside corridors' contributions to protecting water quality, wildlife habitat, agricultural uses,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that relevant state and local agencies be encouraged to provide 18 administrative assistance as necessary to enhance the cooperative effort. 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that solutions developed by statewide, regional, and local groups be 21 reported to future legislatures and that legislation introduced by any of these groups reflect the mutual 22 interests of property owners, developers, concerned citizens, and the tourist industry. 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State send copies of this resolution to any 24 property owner, developer, agricultural, wildlife, local government, conservation district, or other group or 25 organization that is interested or involved in the issues outlined in this resolution. 26 -END-
