JOINT RESOLUTION NO.27 1 2 3 4 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING THE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY COUNCIL TO APPOINT AN AD HOC 5 6 COMMITTEE TO STUDY CERTAIN STATE LANDS MANAGEMENT ISSUES; AND REQUIRING A REPORT 7 OF THE FINDINGS OF THE STUDY TO THE 55TH LEGISLATURE. 8 9 WHEREAS, Montana is fortunate to have a unique and valuable resource of over 5 million acres of 10 state lands; and WHEREAS, the people of Montana have decided through the state constitution that these state 11 lands must be held in trust for the people but may be exchanged or disposed of for full market value and 12 13 in accordance with state law; and WHEREAS, the people of Montana have also decided through the state constitution that proceeds 14 15 from the sale or management of state lands must be deposited into the inviolable public school fund; and WHEREAS, the management of state lands has lately come under increasing scrutiny from 16 17 concerned citizens; and WHEREAS, differing perspectives on the proper management of state lands have led to controversial 18 19 decisions by the Department of State Lands, the Board of Land Commissioners, and District Courts; and WHEREAS, over 40 pieces of legislation regarding the management of state lands have been 20 21 requested by members of the 54th Legislature to resolve the controversies; and 22 WHEREAS, no detailed analysis of overall state lands management is available to provide the proper 23 context needed for reasoned decisions regarding state land management. 24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 25 STATE OF MONTANA: 26 (1) That recreationists, landowners, lessees of state lands, educators, other Montanans, and local 27 government officials be strongly urged to work together to address these issues for long-term benefits to 28 29 the people of Montana.

(2) That the Environmental Quality Council be requested to convene an ad hoc committee of

2	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this study include an analysis of:
3	(1) the impact of state lands on local governments, including the impacts on property taxes and
4	the issue of payments in lieu of taxes to local governments;
5	(2) the long-term advisability of increased sales of state lands, including but not limited to:
6	(a) which state lands would be most advantageous to sell, e.g., isolated tracts, cabinsites,
7	inholdings, or other types of state lands;
8	(b) what potential methods of state lands disposition are available and what their impacts are, e.g.,
9	land exchanges, sales, land banking, or other methods of disposition; and
10	(c) what the impact would be to recreationists, landowners, lessees, other Montanans, and local
11	governments from the increased sale of state lands; and
12	(3) the appropriate method to be used to establish fair and reasonable lease rates for state lands.
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that:
14	(1) the ad hoc committee include the following representatives:
15	(a) two recreationists;
16	(b) two state lands lessees;
17	(c) two local government officials;
18	(d) one member of the general public; and
19	(e) four legislators;
20	(2) the ad hoc committee hold town meetings throughout Montana to provide a forum for a
21	discussion of these issues; and
22	(3) the members of the ad hoc committee be selected on the basis of their willingness and ability
23	to work cooperatively to solve problems.
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ad hoc committee, through the Environmental Quality Council,
25	make recommendations to the 55th Legislature regarding the management of state lands.
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any legislation introduced as a result of these recommendations
27	reflect the mutual interests of recreationists, landowners, lessees, other Montanans, and local governments.
