STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Fiscal Note for SB0004, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act allocating the Office of State Coordinator of Indian Affairs from the Department of Commerce (DOC) to the Governor's Office.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The base budget for the Indian Affairs Coordinator program has been developed in the DOC, and is adequate to fund the program in the Governor's Office.
2. No substantial changes in the program will occur as a result of the reallocation, and the DOC budget for the program will be transferred intact to the Governor's Office. The offices for the Coordinator will be retained in the capitol, thus negating any moving costs.
3. The DOC indicates that the transfer will result in a proportional increase of indirect costs, which would be absorbed by the programs remaining within the department and/or reduced, in the amount of \$11,514 in FY96 and \$11,619 in FY97. It is assumed that there will be a legislative review of and adjustment to indirect costs budgeted in the general appropriations act towards the end of the session, reflective of all bills adopted, and likely in a free conference committee consistent with prior sessions.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Passage of SB4 will cause minimal fiscal impact to state government.


