8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Attendance at Montana law enforcement academy required for sheriffs
11	exemption. (1) A person elected or appointed to the office of sheriff shall attend the Montana law
12	enforcement academy and complete the course within 1 year of taking office.
13	(2) The failure of a sheriff to satisfactorily complete the course offered by the academy constitutes
14	incompetence within the meaning of 2-16-603.
15	(3) A person who satisfactorily completed the course as a deputy sheriff, as required by 7-32-2106,
16	is exempt from the requirement in subsection (1).
17	
18	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
19	integral part of Title 7, chapter 32, part 21, and the provisions of Title 7, chapter 32, part 21, apply to
20	[section 1].
21	
22	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Applicability. [This act] applies to all sheriffs taking office on or after
23	January 1, 1996.

Fiscal Note for SB0093, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act requiring a sheriff to attend the Montana Law Enforcement Academy.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Newly appointed or elected sheriffs will attend the Montana Law Enforcement Academy's existing 10 week Basic Course. No new course will be designed specifically for sheriffs.
- 2. Nine new sheriffs were recently elected in the last election. All of these people had been to training at the Academy in the past. It is projected that 1-2 students a year would need to be added to the Basic Course for retirements, new appointments, or elections every 4 years.
- 3. The cost per student to attend the Basic Course is \$2,500. The fiscal impact on the Montana Law Enforcement Academy would be minimal as these students could be absorbed in the existing attendance rates.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Passage of SB0093 would have no fiscal impact on state government.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

For each sheriff trained at the Academy, the county would pay \$2,500.
