Fiscal Note for SB0171, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act revising physical therapy laws; authorizing licensure of physical therapist assistants and establishing standards for licensure; clarifying requirements for supervising physical therapist assistants, aides, and students; establishing continuing education requirements for physical therapists and assistants by rule.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Approximately 25 initial applicants will qualify as physical therapist assistants in FY96 and 3 new applicants in FY97.
- 2. Approximately 700 licensees will be required to comply with continuing education requirements.
- 3. Revenues are projected to increase \$2,575 in FY96 and \$925 in FY97.
- 4. Fiscal impact will be minimal and can be absorbed in the budget recommendation contained in the Executive Budget.
