7	council and accompanied by the original or a copy of documentation, such as a monthly telephone bill, that
8	clearly indicates the items for which reimbursement is being claimed.

10	funding authority, is <u>also</u> entitled to:

Fiscal Note for SB0279, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act providing legislators limited reimbursement for expenses incurred as a result of conducting legislative business by telephone with personnel of state government agencies; clarifying compensation to members of the districting and apportionment commission, a member-elect of the legislature, a legislative member of certain delegations and committees, and members of the environmental quality council.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- The Legislature will meet during January, February, March and April in the odd-1. numbered years only.
- There will be no special sessions. 2.
- Each legislator will claim about \$12.50 per month for each month when the 3. Legislature is not in session ($$12.50 \times 150 \times 12 = $22,500$ in even-numbered years and $$12.50 \times 150 \times 8 = $15,000$ in odd-numbered years) as reimbursement for telephone expenses while conducting legislative business.
