9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 5-11-702, MCA, is amended to read:

12 **"5-11-702. Participation in Pacific Northwest economic region.** The Pacific Northwest economic
13 region is hereby enacted into law and entered into by the state of Montana as a party and is in full force
14 and effect in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST ECONOMIC REGION

ARTICLE I -- Policy and Purpose

17 (1) States and provinces participating in the Pacific Northwest economic region shall seek to
18 develop and establish policies that:

- 19 (a) promote greater regional collaboration among the seven entities;
- 20 (b) enhance the overall competitiveness of the region in international and domestic markets;
- 21 (c) increase the economic well-being of all citizens in the region; and
- 22 (d) improve the quality of life of the citizens of the Pacific Northwest.

23 (2) (a) States and provinces recognize that there are many public policy areas in which cooperation
24 and joint efforts would be mutually beneficial. These areas include but are not limited to:

- 25 (i) international trade;
- 26 (ii) economic development;
- 27 (iii) human resources;
- 28 (iv) the environment and natural resources;
- 29 (v) energy; and
- 30 (vi) education.

4 (c) Participating states and provinces also agree that there are areas in which cooperation may not
5 be feasible.

(3) The substantive actions of the Pacific Northwest economic region may take the form of uniform legislation enacted by two or more states or provinces or policy initiatives endorsed as appropriate by participating entities. It is not necessary for all states and provinces to participate in each initiative.

ARTICLE II -- Eligible Parties and Effective Date
