9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

1	Section 1. Section 5-11-702, MCA, is amended to read:
2	"5-11-702. Participation in Pacific Northwest economic region. The Pacific Northwest economic
3	region is hereby enacted into law and entered into by the state of Montana as a party and is in full force
4	and effect in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

6	ARTICLE I Policy and Purpose
7	(1) States and provinces participating in the Pacific Northwest economic region shall seek to
8	develop and establish policies that:

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1	"5-11-703. Appointment to Pacific Northwest economic region vacancy. (1) Pursuant to
2	5-11-702, Article III, the governor or a designee and four legislators must be appointed to the delegate
3	council of the Pacific Northwest economic region. The legislative members are appointed as follows:
4	(a) one member to be appointed by the president of the senate;
5	(b) one member to be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;
6	(c) one member to be appointed by the minority leader of the senate; and
7	(d) one member to be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives.
