- (4) In order to protect the public, the board may, in consultation with persons in the specific field of advanced practice registered nursing, adopt specific rules for each field of advanced practice registered nursing for the granting of temporary approval to practice and for determining the supervision of the licensee with temporary approval."

4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING THE LAWS GOVERNING THE BOARD OF NURSING;
5	PROVIDING FOR AN ADDITIONAL MEMBER ON THE BOARD OF NURSING WHO IS AN ADVANCED
6	PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE; AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF NURSING TO GIVE TEMPORARY
7	APPROVAL TO PRACTICE IN A FIELD OF ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSING TO A PERSON
8	WHO HAS COMPLETED THE ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSING EDUCATION REQUIRED IN
9	ORDER TO APPLY TO TAKE THE PERSON'S FIRST NATIONAL CERTIFICATION EXAMINATION;
10	PROVIDING RULEMAKING AUTHORITY FOR TEMPORARY APPROVAL TO PRACTICE; AND AMENDING
11	SECTION SECTIONS 2 15 1844, 37-8-202, AND 37-8-409, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE
12	EFFECTIVE DATES DATE."
13	
14	STATEMENT OF INTENT
15	A statement of intent is required for this bill because it grants rulemaking authority to the board of
16	nursing to give temporary approval and to establish requirements for temporary approval to practice in a
17	field of advanced practice registered nursing. The legislature finds that it is in the public interest to give
18	temporary approval to practice to a person who has completed the advanced practice registered nursing
19	education required in order for the person to apply to take a national certification examination. In order to
20	protect the public, the board of nursing is authorized to make rules regarding the procedures for obtaining
21	temporary approval to practice in each field of advanced practice registered nursing and for the supervision
22	of the nurse. Because the practices of nurse practitioners, nurse-midwives, nurse anesthetists, and clinical
23	nurse specialists are unique, the board may adopt separate requirements for each specialty as necessary
24	and shall consult with practitioners in each field in the development of the rules.

26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

28	SECTION 1. SECTION 2 15-1844, MCA, IS AMENDED TO READ:

(2) The board consists of nine 10 members appointed by the governor with the consent of the

2	(a) four registered professional nurses; at least one such member shall have had at least 5 years
3	in administrative, teaching, or supervisory experience in one or more schools of nursing and at least one
4	such member must be currently engaged in the administration, supervision, or provision of direct client care.
5	Each member shall must:
6	(i) be a graduate of an approved school of nursing;
7	(ii) be a licensed registered professional nurse in this state;
8	(iii) have had at least 5 years' experience in nursing following graduation; and
9	(iv) be currently engaged in the practice of professional nursing and must have practiced for at least
10	δ years.
11	(b) three practical nurses. Each shall <u>must</u> :
12	(i) be a graduate of a school of practical nursing;
13	(ii) be a licensed practical nurse in this state;
14	(iii) have had at least 5 years' experience as a practical nurse; and
15	(iv) be currently engaged in the practice of practical nursing and have practiced for at least 5 years
16	(c) two public members who are not medical practitioners, involved in the practice of nursing of
17	employment of nursing, or administrators of Montana health care facilities.;
18	(d) one advanced practice registered nurse who must:
19	(i) be a graduate of an approved education program for advanced practice registered nurses;
20	(ii) be a licensed registered professional nurse with a certificate in a field of advanced practice
21	registered nursing in this state;
22	(iii) have at least 5 years' experience;
23	(iv) currently be engaged in direct client care and must have practiced as an advanced practice
24	registered nurse for at least-5 years; and
25	(v) have current prescriptive authority and must be assigned as a permanent member of the
26	prescriptive authority committee.
27	(3) All members shall must have been residents of this state for at least 1 year before appointmen
28	and be citizens of the United States.
29	(4) All members shall serve staggered 4 year terms, and a member may not be appointed for more
30	than two consecutive terms. The governor may remove a member from the board for neglect of a duty



required by law or for incompetency or unprofessional or dishonorable conduct.

(5) The board is allocated to the department for administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2.15.121."

SECTION 1. SECTION 37-8-202, MCA, IS AMENDED TO READ:

"37-8-202. Organization -- meetings -- powers and duties. (1) The board shall meet annually and shall elect from among the nine 10 NINE members a president and a secretary. The board shall hold other meetings when necessary to transact its business. A majority of the board constitutes a quorum at any meeting. The department shall keep complete minutes and records of the meetings and rules and orders promulgated by the board.

- (2) The board may make rules necessary to administer this chapter. The board shall prescribe standards for schools preparing persons for registration and licensure under this chapter. It shall provide for surveys of schools at times it considers necessary. It shall approve programs that meet the requirements of this chapter and of the board. The department shall, subject to 37-1-101, examine and issue to and renew licenses of qualified applicants. The board shall conduct hearings on charges that may call for discipline of a licensee, revocation of a license, or removal of schools of nursing from the approved list. It shall cause the prosecution of persons violating this chapter and may incur necessary expenses for prosecutions.
- (3) The board may adopt and the department shall publish forms for use by applicants and others, including license, certificate, and identity forms and other appropriate forms and publications convenient for the proper administration of this chapter. The board may fix reasonable fees for incidental services, within the subject matter delegated by this chapter.
- (4) The board may participate in and pay fees to a national organization of state boards of nursing to ensure interstate endorsement of licenses.
- (5) (a) The board may define the educational requirements and other qualifications applicable to recognition of advanced practice registered nurses. Advanced practice registered nurses are nurses who must have additional professional education beyond the basic nursing degree required of a registered nurse. Additional education must be obtained in courses offered in a university setting or its equivalent. The applicant must be certified or in the process of being certified by a certifying body for advanced practice registered nurses. Advanced practice registered nurses include nurse practitioners, nurse-midwives,



- nurse-anesthetists, and clinical nurse specialists.
- (b) The board of nursing and the board of medical examiners, acting jointly, shall adopt rules regarding authorization for prescriptive authority of nurse specialists. If considered appropriate for a nurse specialist who applies to the board for authorization, prescriptive authority must be granted.
- (6) The board shall establish a program to assist licensed nurses who are found to be physically or mentally impaired by habitual intemperance or the excessive use of narcotic drugs, alcohol, or any other drug or substance. The program must provide assistance to licensees in seeking treatment for substance abuse and monitor their efforts toward rehabilitation. For purposes of funding this program, the board shall adjust the license fee provided for in 37-8-431 commensurate with the cost of the program.
- (7) The board may adopt rules for delegation of nursing tasks by licensed nurses to unlicensed persons.
- (8) The board may fund additional staff, hired by the department, to administer the provisions of this chapter."

Section 2. Section 37-8-409, MCA, is amended to read:

practice. (1) A person licensed under 37-8-406 or 37-8-407 who holds a certificate in nurse midwifery from the American college of nurse midwives a field of advanced practice registered nursing may practice midwifery in the specified field of advanced practice registered nursing upon approval by the board of an amendment to her the person's license granting a certificate of nurse midwifery in a field of advanced practice registered nursing. The board shall grant a certificate of nurse midwifery in a field of advanced practice registered nursing to a person who submits written verification of certification by the American college of nurse midwives a board-approved national certifying body appropriate to the specific field of advanced practice registered nursing and who meets such any other qualification requirements as that the board may prescribe prescribes.

- (2) The board may give temporary approval to practice nurse midwifery for up to 4 months in a specific field of advanced practice registered nursing to a person who has taken the American college of nurse midwives:
 - (a) intends to apply for approval under subsection (1); and
 - (b) has completed the advanced practice registered nursing education required in order for the



person to apply to take the person's first national certification examination AVAILABLE, pending receipt
of official notification of the results of the examination from a board-approved national certifying body
appropriate to the specific field of advanced practice registered pursing.

- (3) If the person fails to obtain certification upon the person's first examination, the temporary approval provided for in subsection (2) expires on receipt of the examination results. The temporary approval may not be extended.
- (4) In order to protect the public, the board may, in consultation with persons in the specific field of advanced practice registered nursing, adopt specific rules for each field of advanced practice registered nursing for the granting of temporary approval to practice and for determining the supervision of the licensee with temporary approval."

NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. COORDINATION INSTRUCTION. IF [THIS ACT] AND HOUSE BILL NO. 518 ARE BOTH PASSED AND APPROVED AND HOUSE BILL NO. 518 AMENDS 37-8-409, THEN SECTION 37-8-409 MUST READ AS FOLLOWS:

- (2) The board may give temporary approval to practice nurse midwifery for up to 4 months in a specific field of advanced practice registered nursing to a person who has taken the American college of nurse midwives:
 - (a) intends to apply for approval under subsection (1); and
- (b) has completed the advanced practice registered nursing education required in order for the person to apply to take the first national certification examination available, pending receipt of official
