17	WHEREAS, the minutes of the committees are becoming increasingly important to the public, to
18	public entities administering acts of the Legislature, and within the judicial system, thereby demanding ever
19	higher guaranties of accuracy, completeness, useability, and timeliness; and
20	WHEREAS, the methods used by the Senate and the House of Representatives to produce minutes
21	of committee meetings may have become technologically obsolete; and
22	WHEREAS, the demand for high-quality and timely minutes of committees may be exceeding the
23	capacity of the Senate and the House of Representatives to produce the minutes unless the traditional
24	methods are augmented by available technology; and
25	WHEREAS, the Senate and the House of Representatives invest a considerable amount of staff and
26	financial resources in producing committee minutes by traditional methods; and
27	WHEREAS, employing technology as a tool in preparing high-quality and timely committee minutes
28	may be a cost-effective approach in meeting the requirements of the Rules of the Montana Legislature and
29	the needs of all persons who use minutes of committees of the Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in conducting the study, the Legislative Council rely upon the experience and the expertise of the members of the respective Legislative Administration Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives for advice.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in conducting the study, the Legislative Council rely upon the experience and the expertise of the Legislative Council Librarian, the State Librarian, the State Law Librarian, the State Archivist, current and former Secretaries of the Senate and Chief Clerks of the House of Representatives, persons knowledgeable about available technology pertinent to the study, and others who may be affected by the form, content, use, timeliness, accuracy, and completeness of minutes of Legislative committees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings, conclusions, and options for legislative consideration to the 55th Legislature.
