NEW SECTION. Section 3. Coordination of fund sources for grants program projects. A sponsor of a grants program project who has applied for a grant for that project under both the reclamation and development grants program and the renewable resource grant and loan program may not receive duplicate funding.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Condition of grants. Disbursement of grant funds under [sections 1 through 6] is subject to the following conditions that must be met by the project sponsor:

- (1) A scope of work and budget for the project must be approved by the department of natural resources and conservation. Reduction in a scope of work or budget may not affect priority activities or improvements.
- (2) Other funds required for project completion must have been committed, and the commitment must be documented.
- (3) The project sponsor shall show satisfactory completion of conditions described in the recommendations section of the project narrative of the reclamation and development grants program report for the 1999 biennium.
- (4) An agreement between the department and the grant applicant must be executed in a timely manner, taking into consideration any changed conditions or circumstances that govern the administration and disbursement of funds.
- (5) Any other specific requirements considered necessary by the department must be met to accomplish the purpose of the grant as evidenced from the application to the department or as defined by the legislature.

NEW SECTION. Section 5. Other appropriations. There is appropriated to any entity of state

1	government that receives a grant under [sections 1 through 6] the amount of the grant upon award of the
