19	(2) If the money in the cultural and aesthetic projects account is insufficient in the biennium ending
20	June 30, 1997, to fund projects in the amount for which they are approved, the approved amount for the
21	projects is reappropriated from the account until money has been disbursed to fully cover appropriations
