3 BY REQUEST OF THE MONTANA ARTS COUNCIL AND THE OFFICE OF BUDGET AND PROGRAM

6 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC
7 PROJECT GRANT AWARDS; AND APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC GRANTS."8
9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
1011 **NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation of cultural and aesthetic grant funds -- priority of**
12 **disbursement.** (1) The Montana arts council shall award grants for projects authorized by and limited to
13 the amounts appropriated by this section. Money must be disbursed in priority order, first to projects
14 covered under subsection (2), second to the project listed in subsection (3), third to the projects listed in
15 subsection (5), and fourth to the project listed in subsection (4). The Montana arts council shall disburse
16 money to projects authorized by this section through grant contracts between the Montana arts council and
17 the grant recipient. The award contract must bind the parties to contingencies, if any, listed with the
18 appropriation in subsection (5).19 (2) If the money in the cultural and aesthetic projects account is insufficient in the biennium ending
20 June 30, 1997, to fund projects in the amount for which they are approved, the approved amount for the
21 projects is reappropriated from the account until money has been disbursed to fully cover appropriations
22 or until October 1, 1998, whichever comes first.23 (3) There is appropriated to the Montana historical society \$15,000 for the biennium ending July
24 1, 1999, for care and conservation of capitol complex artwork. This appropriation is recommended to be
25 repeated for two successive bienniums and to be reviewed in fiscal year 2001 to determine if it should
26 continue.27 (4) There is appropriated to the Montana historical society \$95,000 for the biennium ending July
28 1, 1999, for capitol stained glass restoration.29 (5) The following projects are approved and amounts appropriated to the Montana arts council for

 18 appropriations made in subsection (5) to the Montana arts council for project evaluations. The evaluations
 19 must be done after July 1, 1998, and results must be included in a report on the projects funded by
 20 subsections (1) through (5) to be submitted to the 56th legislature.

 22 **NEW SECTION.** **Section 2. Reversion of granted money.** (1) On October 1, 1998, money
 23 reappropriated in [section 1(2)] but not disbursed reverts to the cultural and aesthetic projects account
 24 provided for in 15-35-108.

25 (2) On July 1, 1999, the unencumbered balance of the 1999 biennium grants reverts to the cultural
 26 and aesthetic project account provided for in 15-35-108.

 28 **NEW SECTION.** **Section 3. Reduction of grants.** If money in the cultural and aesthetic project
 29 account is insufficient to fund projects at the appropriation levels contained in [section 1], the Montana arts
 30 council shall allocate the available money on a pro rata basis to the authorized projects.
