DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

11	WHEREAS, the Montana National Guard is recognized by the highest command levels as an
12	outstanding military organization; and
13	WHEREAS, the Montana National Guard has been assigned a force structure that provides
14	exceptional opportunity as it moves into the 21st century; and
15	WHEREAS, the Montana National Guard cannot and should not depend solely upon federal programs
16	to entice Montana citizenry to join or stay in the Guard; and
17	WHEREAS, the state's investment of \$1,14 million in the Montana National Guard scholarship
18	EDUCATION BENEFIT program could provide to Montana communities approximately \$2 million annually
19	AN ECONOMIC BENEFIT that is currently not being realized in wages and tax revenue.

21	STATEMENT OF INTENT
22	A statement of intent is necessary for this bill because [section 1] authorizes the department of
