14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
15	
16	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Legislative findings. The legislature finds that Article II, section 35,
17	of the Montana constitution states that the legislature may give Montana veterans special consideration.
18	Accordingly, there are geographical requirements for veterans' cemeteries for proper interment. Therefore,
19	it is necessary to provide guidelines for the siting and construction of an eastern Montana state veterans'
20	cemetery.
21	
22	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Request for proposals. (1) The board of veterans' affairs shall request
23	that proposals for the siting of a new state veterans' cemetery be submitted to the board from town, city,
24	county, and tribal governments in the counties enumerated in [section 4]. The request must:
25	(a) be made in the form of a request for proposals;
26	(b) specify 90 days from the date on which the requests for proposals are mailed as the date on
27	which all proposals are to be received by the board; and
28	(c) contain the information required under subsection (2) and other information determined
29	necessary by the board.
30	(2) The request for proposal must:



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(a) require that information be submitted by a town, city, county, or tribal government as part of
 any proposal according to the requirements in 38 U.S.C. 2408, 38 CFR, part 39, and the most recent
 department of veterans affairs National Cemetery System Program Guide 40-1, state cemetery grants
 program;

(b) include the extent to which land is donated to the state for an eastern Montana state veterans' cemetery; and

7 (c) state the proximity to the veterans' affairs field offices and department of military affairs
8 support facilities.

9

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Board to select site. (1) Proposals submitted in response to the request 11 for proposals required by [section 2] must be evaluated by the board of veterans' affairs.

12 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), the board must be compensated, reimbursed, and 13 otherwise governed by the provisions of 2-15-122 regarding advisory councils.

14 (3) The board members must receive an honorarium of \$50 for each day spent performing the 15 duties required in [sections 2 through 6] that does not constitute a regular board meeting.

16 (4) The board shall meet as often as necessary to perform the duties assigned by [sections 2 17 through 6]. The board shall consider, evaluate, and select the location for the eastern Montana state 18 veterans' cemetery according to the procedure and criteria provided for in [sections 2 through 6].

(5) The department of military affairs shall provide staff and budgetary, administrative, and clerical
 services to the board as the board or its presiding officer requests.

(6) The board must receive assistance and information, as requested, from the department of
 administration, architecture and engineering division, and other executive agencies that may have
 information relevant to siting and supporting a state veterans' cemetery.

(7) The board's site selection function terminates on the date of the announcement by the governor
of the winning proposal, in accordance with [section 6].

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Site selection procedure and criteria. (1) The board of veterans' affairs
 28 may not consider a proposal unless the proposal:

29 (a) is submitted within the time required by the request for proposal;

30 (b) contains the criteria and additional information required by [section 2]; and



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(c) is submitted by a town, city, county, or tribal government located in Big Horn, Carter, Custer,
 Daniels, Dawson, Fallon, Garfield, McCone, Musselshell, Petroleum, Phillips, Powder River, Prairie, Richland,
 Roosevelt, Rosebud, Sheridan, Treasure, Valley, Wibaux, or Yellowstone County.

4 (2) The board shall determine a maximum numeric value for each of the criteria required in [section 5 2] and the tie-breaker criteria described in [section 6(2)]. Criteria that the board determines to be of more 6 relative importance must be awarded a greater maximum value. The board shall rate each proposal 7 considered by it by using a weighted-scale process that assigns a numeric score for each criterion and then 8 totals the score for each proposal. The score for each criterion and proposal must be determined by the 9 extent to which each criterion is satisfied, based upon a documented demonstration.

NEW SECTION. Section 5. Site visitations and hearings required. The board of veterans' affairs 11 12 shall determine the three proposals with the highest numeric scores. The board shall eliminate the other 13 proposals from further consideration. As soon as possible after elimination of the other sites, the board shall 14 conduct onsite reviews of the remaining candidate sites by both conducting an onsite tour of each of the candidate sites and holding a public hearing on the subject of the cemetery in the community where each 15 proposed site is located. The purpose of the tour and hearing is to receive information concerning the extent 16 17 to which each candidate site satisfies the criteria provided in [section 2]. The hearings must be conducted under procedures determined by the board, and the board shall give notice of each hearing by 18 advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation in the county of each candidate site. 19

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 6. Site selection. (1) After completing the onsite reviews required by 22 [section 5], the board shall again score each of the candidate sites by applying the criteria and scoring 23 method provided in [section 4].

(2) If two or more proposals receive the same total score, the board shall determine the leading
 proposal by scoring those proposals on the following criteria for the community in which the cemetery
 would be located:

27 (a) the extent to which land is donated to the state for an eastern Montana veterans' cemetery;28 and

(b) the proximity to the veterans' affairs division field offices and department of military affairs
support facilities.



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1	(3) The cemetery must be located at the proposed site that receives the highest numeric score
2	using the procedure provided in this section. Upon selection of the winning proposal by the board, the
3	board shall inform the governor of its selection. The board shall submit its selection to the governor no later
4	than 250 days after [the effective date of this section]. The governor shall review the selection process to
5	ensure that the board has not made an error in process or in fact. If the governor determines that an error
6	has been made, the governor shall remand the recommendation to the board for further evaluation. The
7	governor shall make a public announcement of the board's selection upon determining that no errors have
8	been made.

10	Section 7. Section 10-2-601, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"10-2-601. State veterans' eemetery cemeteries. The department of military affairs shall establish
12	a state veterans' comotory cemeteries. The A cemetery must be located at Fort William Henry Harrison,
13	Lewis and Clark County, Montana, and at the location chosen pursuant to [sections 1 through 6]."

15	Section 8. Section 10-2-602, MCA, is amended to read:
16	"10-2-602. Rulemaking authority. The department of military affairs shall adopt rules that provide

20	Section 9. Section 10-2-603, MCA, is amended to read:
21	"10-2-603. Special revenue account use of funds solicitation. (1) There is an account in the
22	special revenue fund to the credit of the department of military affairs for the state veterans' comptory
23	cemeteries.
24	(2) Plot allowances, donations, and, as provided in 61-3-332, revenue from veterans' license plate
25	sales must be deposited into the account.
26	(3) As appropriated by the legislature, money in the account may be used only for the construction,
27	maintenance, operation, and administration of the state veterans' cemetery cemeteries.
28	(4) The department of military affairs may solicit veterans' license plate sales and donations on
29	behalf of the state veterans' comotory <u>cemeteries</u> ."
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Section 10. Section 61-3-332, MCA, is amended to read:

2 "61-3-332. Number plates. (1) A motor vehicle that is driven upon the streets or highways of 3 Montana must display both front and rear number plates, bearing the distinctive number assigned to the 4 vehicle. The number plates are in 10 series: one series for owners of motorcars, one for owners of motor 5 vehicles of the motorcycle or quadricycle type, one for trailers, one for trucks, one for dealers in vehicles 6 of the motorcycle or quadricycle type that bear the distinctive letters "MCD" or the letters "MC" and the 7 word "DEALER", one for franchised dealers in new motorcars (including trucks and trailers) or new and 8 used motorcars (including trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letter "D" or the word "DEALER", 9 one for dealers in used motorcars only (including used trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letters "UD" or the letter "U" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in trailers and/or semitrailers (new or used) 10 that bear the distinctive letters "DTR" or the letters "TR" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in 11 12 recreational vehicles that bear the distinctive letters "RV" or the letter "R" and the word "DEALER", and 13 one for special license plates. All markings for the various kinds of dealers' plates must be placed on the 14 number plates assigned to the dealer, in the position that the department designates.

15 (2) All number plates for motor vehicles must be issued for a minimum period of 4 years, bear a 16 distinctive marking, and be furnished by the state. In years when number plates are not issued, the 17 department shall provide nonremovable stickers bearing appropriate registration numbers that must be 18 affixed to the license plates in use.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this section, the department shall create a new design for number
plates as provided in this section.

(4) In the case of motorcars and trucks, plates must be of metal 6 inches wide and 12 inches in
 length. The outline of the state of Montana must be used as a distinctive border on the license plates, and
 the word "Montana" and the year must be placed across the plates. Registration plates must be treated
 with a reflectorized background material according to specifications prescribed by the department.

(5) The distinctive registration numbers must begin with a number one or with a letter-number combination, such as "A 1" or "AA 1", or any other similar combination of letters and numbers. The distinctive registration number or letter-number combination assigned to the vehicle must appear on the plate preceded by the number of the county and appearing in horizontal order on the same horizontal baseline. The county number must be separated from the distinctive registration number by a separation mark unless a letter-number combination is used. The dimensions of the numerals and letters must be



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1 determined by the department, and all county and registration numbers must be of equal height.

2

3 number plates must bear the following distinctive markings:

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(a) For vehicles owned by the state, the department may designate the prefix number for the
various state departments. All numbered plates issued to state departments must bear the words "State
Owned", and a year number may not be indicated on the plates because these numbered plates are of a
permanent nature and will be replaced by the department only when the physical condition of numbered
plates requires it.

(6) For the use of tax-exempt motor vehicles, in addition to the markings provided in this section,

(b) For vehicles that are owned by the counties, municipalities, and special districts, as defined in 9 18-8-202, organized under the laws of Montana and not operating for profit, and that are used and 10 operated by officials and employees in the line of duty and for vehicles on loan from the United States 11 12 government or the state of Montana to, or owned by, the civil air patrol and used and operated by officials and employees in the line of duty, there must be placed on the number plates assigned, in a position that 13 14 the department may designate, the letter "X" or the word "EXEMPT". Distinctive registration numbers for 15 plates assigned to motor vehicles of each of the counties in the state and those of the municipalities and 16 special districts that obtain plates within each county must begin with number one and be numbered 17 consecutively. Because these number plates are of a permanent nature, they are subject to replacement 18 by the department only when the physical condition of the number plates requires it and a year number may 19 not be displayed on the number plates.

20 (7) On all number plates assigned to motor vehicles of the truck and trailer type, other than 21 tax-exempt trucks and tax-exempt trailers, there must appear the letter "T" or the word "TRUCK" on plates 22 assigned to trucks and the letters "TR" or the word "TRAILER" on plates assigned to trailers and 23 housetrailers. The letters "MC" or the word "CYCLE" must appear on plates assigned to vehicles of the 24 motorcycle or quadricycle type.

(8) Number plates issued to a passenger car, truck, trailer, or vehicle of the motorcycle or
 quadricycle type may be transferred only to a replacement passenger car, truck, trailer, or motorcycle- or
 quadricycle-type vehicle. A registration or license fee may not be assessed upon a transfer of a number
 plate under 61-3-317 and 61-3-335.

(9) For the purpose of this chapter, the several counties of the state are assigned numbers as
follows: Silver Bow, 1; Cascade, 2; Yellowstone, 3; Missoula, 4; Lewis and Clark, 5; Gallatin, 6; Flathead,



7; Fergus, 8; Powder River, 9; Carbon, 10; Phillips, 11; Hill, 12; Ravalli, 13; Custer, 14; Lake, 15; Dawson, 1 2 16; Roosevelt, 17; Beaverhead, 18; Chouteau, 19; Valley, 20; Toole, 21; Big Horn, 22; Musselshell, 23; 3 Blaine, 24; Madison, 25; Pondera, 26; Richland, 27; Powell, 28; Rosebud, 29; Deer Lodge, 30; Teton, 31; 4 Stillwater, 32; Treasure, 33; Sheridan, 34; Sanders, 35; Judith Basin, 36; Daniels, 37; Glacier, 38; Fallon, 5 39; Sweet Grass, 40; McCone, 41; Carter, 42; Broadwater, 43; Wheatland, 44; Prairie, 45; Granite, 46; 6 Meagher, 47; Liberty, 48; Park, 49; Garfield, 50; Jefferson, 51; Wibaux, 52; Golden Valley, 53; Mineral, 7 54; Petroleum, 55; Lincoln, 56. Any new counties must be assigned numbers by the department as they 8 may be formed, beginning with the number 57.

9 (10) Each type of special license plate approved by the legislature, except collegiate license plates authorized in 61-3-463, must be a separate series of plates, numbered as provided in subsection (5), except 10 11 that the county number must be replaced by a nonremovable design or decal designating the group or 12 organization to which the applicant belongs. Unless otherwise specifically stated in this section, the special 13 plates are subject to the same rules and laws as govern the issuance of regular license plates, must be 14 placed or mounted on a vehicle owned by the person who is eligible to receive them, and must be removed 15 upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle. The special license plates must be issued to national guard 16 members, former prisoners of war, handicapped persons, reservists, disabled veterans, survivors of the 17 Pearl Harbor attack, veterans of the armed services, or veterans of the armed services who were awarded 18 the purple heart medal, who comply with the following provisions:

(a) An active member of the Montana national guard may be issued special license plates with a
design or decal displaying the letters "NG". The adjutant general shall issue to each active member of the
Montana national guard a certificate authorizing the department to issue national guard plates, numbered
in sets of two with a different number on each set, and the member shall surrender the plates to the
department upon becoming ineligible to use them.

(b) An active member of the reserve armed forces of the United States of America who is a resident of this state may be issued special license plates with a design or decal displaying the following: United States army reserve, AR (symbol); United States naval reserve, NR (anchor); United States air force reserve, AFR (symbol); and United States marine corps reserve, MCR (globe and anchor). The commanding officer of each armed forces reserve unit shall issue to each eligible member of the reserve unit a certificate authorizing the issuance of special license plates, numbered in sets of two with a different number on each set. The member shall surrender the plates to the department upon becoming ineligible to use them.



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- (c) (i) A resident of Montana who is a veteran of the armed forces of the United States and who
 is 100% disabled because of an injury that has been determined by the department of veterans affairs to
 be service-connected may, upon presentation to the department of proof of the 100% disability, be issued:
 (A) a special license plate under this section with a design or decal displaying the letters "DV"; or
 (B) one set of any other military-related plates that the disabled veteran is eligible to receive under
 this section.
- 7 (ii) The fee for original or renewal registration by a 100% disabled veteran for a passenger vehicle
 8 or a truck with a GVW-rated capacity of 1 ton or less is \$5 and is in lieu of all other fees and taxes for that
 9 vehicle under this chapter.
 - (iii) Special license plates issued to a disabled veteran are not transferable to another person.

(iv) A disabled veteran is not entitled to a special disabled veteran's license plate for more than one
vehicle.

- (v) A vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled veteran's plate and that is conveying a 100% disabled
 veteran is entitled to the parking privileges allowed a handicapped person's vehicle under this title.
- 15 (d) A Montana resident who is a veteran of the armed forces of the United States and was 16 captured and held prisoner by a military force of a foreign nation, documented by the veteran's service 17 record, may upon application and presentation of proof be issued special license plates, numbered in sets 18 of two with a different number on each set, with a design or decal displaying the words "ex-prisoner of 19 war" or an abbreviation the department considers appropriate.
- 20 (e) Except as provided in subsection (10)(c), upon payment of all taxes and fees required by parts 21 3 and 5 of this chapter and upon furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant meets 22 the requirements of this subsection (10)(e), the department shall issue to a Montana resident who is a 23 veteran of the armed services of the United States special license plates, numbered in sets of two with a 24 different number on each set, designed to indicate that the applicant is a survivor of the Pearl Harbor attack 25 if the applicant was a member of the United States armed forces on December 7, 1941, was on station on 26 December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. (Hawaii time) at Pearl Harbor, the island 27 of Oahu, or offshore at a distance of not more than 3 miles, and received an honorable discharge from the 28 United States armed forces. If special license plates issued under this subsection are lost, stolen, or 29 mutilated, the recipient of the plates is entitled to replacement plates upon request and without charge.
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(f) A motor vehicle owner and resident of this state who is a veteran or the surviving spouse of

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a veteran of the armed services of the United States may be issued license plates inscribed as provided in
subsection (10)(f)(i) if the veteran was separated from the armed services under other than dishonorable
circumstances or was awarded the purple heart medal:

(i) Upon submission of a department of defense form 214(DD-214) or its successor or documents
showing an other-than-dishonorable discharge or a reenlistment, proper identification, and other relevant
documents to show an applicant's qualification under this subsection, there must be issued to the applicant,
in lieu of the regular license plates prescribed by law, special license plates numbered in sets of two with
a different number on each set. The plates must display:

9 (A) the word "VETERAN" and a symbol signifying the United States army, United States navy, 10 United States air force, United States marine corps, or United States coast guard, according to the record 11 of service verified in the application; or

12 (B) a symbol representing the purple heart medal.

(ii) Plates must be furnished by the department to the county treasurer, who shall issue them to a qualified veteran or to the veteran's surviving spouse. The plates must be placed or mounted on the vehicle owned by the veteran or the veteran's surviving spouse designated in the application and must be removed upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle.

(iii) Except as provided in subsection (10)(c), a veteran or surviving spouse who receives special
license plates under this subsection (10)(f) is liable for payment of all taxes and fees required under parts
3 and 4 of this chapter and a special veteran's or purple heart medal license plate fee of \$10. Upon an
original application for a license under this subsection (10)(f), the county treasurer shall:

(A) deposit \$3 of the special fee in the county general fund;

(B) remit \$1 for deposit in the state general fund; and

(C) deposit the remainder of the special fee in the state special revenue account established in
 10-2-603 for administration, construction, operation, and maintenance of the state veterans' eemetery

26 (iv) Upon subsequent annual renewal of registration, the county treasurer shall deposit all of the
 27 special fee as provided in subsection (10)(f)(iii)(C).

(g) A Montana resident who is eligible to receive a special parking permit under 49-4-301 may,
upon written application on a form prescribed by the department, be issued a special license plate with a
design or decal bearing a representation of a wheelchair as the symbol of the handicapped person."

3	using the procedure provided in this section. Upon selection of the winning proposal by the board, the
4	board shall inform the governor of its selection. The board shall submit its selection to the governor no later
5	than 250 days after [the effective date of this section]. The governor shall review the selection process to
6	ensure that the board has not made an error in process or in fact. If the governor determines that an error
7	has been made, the governor shall remand the recommendation to the board for further evaluation. The
8	governor shall make a public announcement of the board's selection upon determining that no errors have
9	been made.

11	Section 7. Section 10-2-601, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"10-2-601. State veterans' eemeteries. The department of military affairs shall establish
13	e state veterans' eemetery cemeteries. The <u>A</u> cemetery must be located at Fort William Henry Harrison,
14	Lewis and Clark County, Montana, and at the location chosen pursuant to (sections 1 through 6]."

16	Section 8. Section 10-2-602, MCA, is amended to read:
17	"10-2-602. Rulemaking authority. The department of military affairs shall adopt rules that provide
18	criteria for determining which veterans may be buried in the <u>a</u> state veterans' cemetery. The criteria must
19	include, but are not limited to, discharge status and length of service."
20	
21	Section 9. Section 10-2-603, MCA, is amended to read:
22	"10-2-603. Special revenue account use of funds solicitation. (1) There is an account in the
23	special revenue fund to the credit of the department of military affairs for the state veterans' cemetery
24	cemeteries.
25	(2) Plot allowances, donations, and, as provided in 61-3-332, revenue from veterans' license plate
26	sales must be deposited into the account.
27	(3) As appropriated by the legislature, money in the account may be used only for the construction,
28	maintenance, operation, and administration of the state veterans' cometery cemeteries.
29	(4) The department of military affairs may solicit veterans' license plate sales and donations on
30	behalf of the state veterans' cometery <u>cemeteries</u> ."

Section 10. Section 61-3-332, MCA, is amended to read:

2 "61-3-332. Number plates. (1) A motor vehicle that is driven upon the streets or highways of 3 Montana must display both front and rear number plates, bearing the distinctive number assigned to the 4 vehicle. The number plates are in 10 series: one series for owners of motorcars, one for owners of motor 5 vehicles of the motorcycle or quadricycle type, one for trailers, one for trucks, one for dealers in vehicles 6 of the motorcycle or quadricycle type that bear the distinctive letters "MCD" or the letters "MC" and the 7 word "DEALER", one for franchised dealers in new motorcars (including trucks and trailers) or new and 8 used motorcars (including trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letter "D" or the word "DEALER", 9 one for dealers in used motorcars only (including used trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letters 10 "UD" or the letter "U" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in trailers and/or semitrailers (new or used) 11 that bear the distinctive letters "DTR" or the letters "TR" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in 12 recreational vehicles that bear the distinctive letters "RV" or the letter "R" and the word "DEALER", and 13 one for special license plates. All markings for the various kinds of dealers' plates must be placed on the 14 number plates assigned to the dealer, in the position that the department designates.

15 (2) All number plates for motor vehicles must be issued for a minimum period of 4 years, bear a 16 distinctive marking, and be furnished by the state. In years when number plates are not issued, the 17 department shall provide nonremovable stickers bearing appropriate registration numbers that must be 18 affixed to the license plates in use.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this section, the department shall create a new design for numberplates as provided in this section.

(4) In the case of motorcars and trucks, plates must be of metal 6 inches wide and 12 inches in
length. The outline of the state of Montana must be used as a distinctive border on the license plates, and
the word "Montana" and the year must be placed across the plates. Registration plates must be treated
with a reflectorized background material according to specifications prescribed by the department.

(5) The distinctive registration numbers must begin with a number one or with a letter-number combination, such as "A 1" or "AA 1", or any other similar combination of letters and numbers. The distinctive registration number or letter-number combination assigned to the vehicle must appear on the plate preceded by the number of the county and appearing in horizontal order on the same horizontal baseline. The county number must be separated from the distinctive registration number by a separation mark unless a letter-number combination is used. The dimensions of the numerals and letters must be



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1 determined by the department, and all county and registration numbers must be of equal height.

2 (6) For the use of tax-exempt motor vehicles, in addition to the markings provided in this section,
3 number plates must bear the following distinctive markings:

4 (a) For vehicles owned by the state, the department may designate the prefix number for the 5 various state departments. All numbered plates issued to state departments must bear the words "State 6 Owned", and a year number may not be indicated on the plates because these numbered plates are of a 7 permanent nature and will be replaced by the department only when the physical condition of numbered 8 plates requires it.

9 (b) For vehicles that are owned by the counties, municipalities, and special districts, as defined in 10 18-8-202, organized under the laws of Montana and not operating for profit, and that are used and 11 operated by officials and employees in the line of duty and for vehicles on loan from the United States 12 government or the state of Montana to, or owned by, the civil air patrol and used and operated by officials 13 and employees in the line of duty, there must be placed on the number plates assigned, in a position that 14 the department may designate, the letter "X" or the word "EXEMPT". Distinctive registration numbers for 15 plates assigned to motor vehicles of each of the counties in the state and those of the municipalities and 16 special districts that obtain plates within each county must begin with number one and be numbered 17 consecutively. Because these number plates are of a permanent nature, they are subject to replacement 18 by the department only when the physical condition of the number plates requires it and a year number may 19 not be displayed on the number plates.

20 (7) On all number plates assigned to motor vehicles of the truck and trailer type, other than 21 tax-exempt trucks and tax-exempt trailers, there must appear the letter "T" or the word "TRUCK" on plates 22 assigned to trucks and the letters "TR" or the word "TRAILER" on plates assigned to trailers and 23 housetrailers. The letters "MC" or the word "CYCLE" must appear on plates assigned to vehicles of the 24 motorcycle or quadricycle type.

(8) Number plates issued to a passenger car, truck, trailer, or vehicle of the motorcycle or
quadricycle type may be transferred only to a replacement passenger car, truck, trailer, or motorcycle- or
quadricycle-type vehicle. A registration or license fee may not be assessed upon a transfer of a number
plate under 61-3-317 and 61-3-335.

(9) For the purpose of this chapter, the several counties of the state are assigned numbers as
follows: Silver Bow, 1; Cascade, 2; Yellowstone, 3; Missoula, 4; Lewis and Clark, 5; Gallatin, 6; Flathead,



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7; Fergus, 8; Powder River, 9; Carbon, 10; Phillips, 11; Hill, 12; Ravalli, 13; Custer, 14; Lake, 15; Dawson, 1 2 16; Roosevelt, 17; Beaverhead, 18; Chouteau, 19; Valley, 20; Toole, 21; Big Horn, 22; Musselshell, 23; 3 Blaine, 24; Madison, 25; Pondera, 26; Richland, 27; Powell, 28; Rosebud, 29; Deer Lodge, 30; Teton, 31; 4 Stillwater, 32; Treasure, 33; Sheridan, 34; Sanders, 35; Judith Basin, 36; Daniels, 37; Glacier, 38; Fallon, 5 39; Sweet Grass, 40; McCone, 41; Carter, 42; Broadwater, 43; Wheatland, 44; Prairie, 45; Granite, 46; 6 Meagher, 47; Liberty, 48; Park, 49; Garfield, 50; Jefferson, 51; Wibaux, 52; Golden Valley, 53; Mineral. 7 54; Petroleum, 55; Lincoln, 56. Any new counties must be assigned numbers by the department as they 8 may be formed, beginning with the number 57.

9 (10) Each type of special license plate approved by the legislature, except collegiate license plates 10 authorized in 61-3-463, must be a separate series of plates, numbered as provided in subsection (5), except 11 that the county number must be replaced by a nonremovable design or decal designating the group or 12 organization to which the applicant belongs. Unless otherwise specifically stated in this section, the special 13 plates are subject to the same rules and laws as govern the issuance of regular license plates, must be 14 placed or mounted on a vehicle owned by the person who is eligible to receive them, and must be removed 15 upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle. The special license plates must be issued to national guard 16 members, former prisoners of war, handicapped persons, reservists, disabled veterans, survivors of the 17 Pearl Harbor attack, veterans of the armed services, or veterans of the armed services who were awarded 18 the purple heart medal, who comply with the following provisions:

(a) An active member of the Montana national guard may be issued special license plates with a
design or decal displaying the letters "NG". The adjutant general shall issue to each active member of the
Montana national guard a certificate authorizing the department to issue national guard plates, numbered
in sets of two with a different number on each set, and the member shall surrender the plates to the
department upon becoming ineligible to use them.

(b) An active member of the reserve armed forces of the United States of America who is a
resident of this state may be issued special license plates with a design or decal displaying the following:
United States army reserve, AR (symbol); United States naval reserve, NR (anchor); United States air force
reserve, AFR (symbol); and United States marine corps reserve, MCR (globe and anchor). The commanding
officer of each armed forces reserve unit shall issue to each eligible member of the reserve unit a certificate
authorizing the issuance of special license plates, numbered in sets of two with a different number on each
set. The member shall surrender the plates to the department upon becoming ineligible to use them.



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(c) (i) A resident of Montana who is a veteran of the armed forces of the United States and who
is 100% disabled because of an injury that has been determined by the department of veterans affairs to
be service-connected may, upon presentation to the department of proof of the 100% disability, be issued:
(A) a special license plate under this section with a design or decal displaying the letters "DV"; or
(B) one set of any other military-related plates that the disabled veteran is eligible to receive under
this section.

7 (ii) The fee for original or renewal registration by a 100% disabled veteran for a passenger vehicle
8 or a truck with a GVW-rated capacity of 1 ton or less is \$5 and is in lieu of all other fees and taxes for that
9 vehicle under this chapter.

(iii) Special license plates issued to a disabled veteran are not transferable to another person.

(iv) A disabled veteran is not entitled to a special disabled veteran's license plate for more than one
vehicle.

(v) A vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled veteran's plate and that is conveying a 100% disabled
 veteran is entitled to the parking privileges allowed a handicapped person's vehicle under this title.

15 (d) A Montana resident who is a veteran of the armed forces of the United States and was 16 captured and held prisoner by a military force of a foreign nation, documented by the veteran's service 17 record, may upon application and presentation of proof be issued special license plates, numbered in sets 18 of two with a different number on each set, with a design or decal displaying the words "ex-prisoner of 19 war" or an abbreviation the department considers appropriate.

20 (e) Except as provided in subsection (10)(c), upon payment of all taxes and fees required by parts 21 3 and 5 of this chapter and upon furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant meets 22 the requirements of this subsection (10)(e), the department shall issue to a Montana resident who is a 23 veteran of the armed services of the United States special license plates, numbered in sets of two with a 24 different number on each set, designed to indicate that the applicant is a survivor of the Pearl Harbor attack 25 if the applicant was a member of the United States armed forces on December 7, 1941, was on station on 26 December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. (Hawaii time) at Pearl Harbor, the island 27 of Oahu, or offshore at a distance of not more than 3 miles, and received an honorable discharge from the United States armed forces. If special license plates issued under this subsection are lost, stolen, or 28 29 mutilated, the recipient of the plates is entitled to replacement plates upon request and without charge.

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(f) A motor vehicle owner and resident of this state who is a veteran or the surviving spouse of



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a veteran of the armed services of the United States may be issued license plates inscribed as provided in
 subsection (10)(f)(i) if the veteran was separated from the armed services under other than dishonorable
 circumstances or was awarded the purple heart medal:

4 (i) Upon submission of a department of defense form 214(DD-214) or its successor or documents
5 showing an other-than-dishonorable discharge or a reenlistment, proper identification, and other relevant
6 documents to show an applicant's qualification under this subsection, there must be issued to the applicant,
7 in lieu of the regular license plates prescribed by law, special license plates numbered in sets of two with
8 a different number on each set. The plates must display:

9 (A) the word "VETERAN" and a symbol signifying the United States army, United States navy, 10 United States air force, United States marine corps, or United States coast guard, according to the record 11 of service verified in the application; or

12

(B) a symbol representing the purple heart medal.

(ii) Plates must be furnished by the department to the county treasurer, who shall issue them to a qualified veteran or to the veteran's surviving spouse. The plates must be placed or mounted on the vehicle owned by the veteran or the veteran's surviving spouse designated in the application and must be removed upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle.

(iii) Except as provided in subsection (10)(c), a veteran or surviving spouse who receives special
license plates under this subsection (10)(f) is liable for payment of all taxes and fees required under parts
3 and 4 of this chapter and a special veteran's or purple heart medal license plate fee of \$10. Upon an
original application for a license under this subsection (10)(f), the county treasurer shall:

(B) remit \$1 for deposit in the state general fund; and

(A) deposit \$3 of the special fee in the county general fund;

(C) deposit the remainder of the special fee in the state special revenue account established in
 10-2-603 for administration, construction, operation, and maintenance of the state veterans' eemetery
 <u>cemeteries</u>.

26 (iv) Upon subsequent annual renewal of registration, the county treasurer shall deposit all of the
27 special fee as provided in subsection (10)(f)(iii)(C).

(g) A Montana resident who is eligible to receive a special parking permit under 49-4-301 may,
 upon written application on a form prescribed by the department, be issued a special license plate with a
 design or decal bearing a representation of a wheelchair as the symbol of the handicapped person."



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1	NEW SECTION. Section 11. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the general VETERAN'S
2	LICENSE PLATE FEE ACCOUNT IN THE STATE SPECIAL REVENUE fund \$10,000 to the board of veterans'
3	affairs for expenses incurred in selecting a site for the eastern Montana state veterans' cemetery and for
4	support and travel costs for members and staff and honoraria for members. This appropriation is effective
5	through the fiscal year ending June 30, 1999.

7	NEW SECTION. Section 12. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send
8	a copy of [this act] to each tribal government located on the four Montana reservations in eastern Montana

11	NEW SECTION. Section 13. Effective dates. (1) [Sections 1 through 10, 12, and 14 and this
12	section) are effective on passage and approval.
13	(2) [Section 11] is effective July 1, 1997.

15	NEW SECTION, Section 14. Termination. [Sections 1 through 6] terminate June 30, 1999.
