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#### STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Fiscal Note for <u>HB0028, as introduced</u>

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION: A act requiring the Superintendent of Public Instruction, upon request and in compliance with state and federal confidentiality laws, to disclose required student assessment data for comparison purposes.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Office of Public Instruction currently gathers student assessment data at the direction of the Board of Public Education (Rule 10.56.101, ARM).
- 2. The current practices of the office of public instruction include:

a) Collecting and compiling the statewide test results and annually providing a statewide summary of the data.

b) Not comparing districts on the basis of a single, district average score.

c) Assisting districts to compare their local scores with the state and national norms by providing a report back to districts that includes a copy of the statewide summary and their own reported scores so that they have the opportunity to verify their data and use the results locally.

d) Protecting the privacy rights of students, as required by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), by limiting access to data files that contain individually identifiable information.

e) Responding to requests for the student assessment data in compliance with statutes, rules, and confidentiality requirements set out in law.

f) Assisting districts to expand the assessment tools that are used to ensure and improve the effectiveness of the instructional program.

- 3. HB 28 applies only to student assessment data collected and maintained by OPI and not data retained in local school records nor to specialized reports.
- 4. OPI will continue to comply with the confidentiality requirements of state and federal law and the administrative rules of the Board of Public Education.
- 5. In order to make student assessment data more usable for researchers and policy makers, OPI will simplify file formats and aggregate data where appropriate to protect privacy. 0.2 FTE will be needed to build and maintain the public data files and respond to requests for data and assistance with using the data. The position is estimated to be a Grade 14 Research Specialist at a cost of \$6,400 (salary and benefits of \$31,835 x 0.2 FTE).
- 6. OPI will respond to requests for student assessment data by providing electronic files to the requestor along with a set of instructions and guidelines for understanding the data elements. Assuming no more than 50 requests annually for these data files, OPI will incur minimal expenses related to the production and distribution of diskettes and instructions.
